TAFT DESCRIBES BELIEVE IT OR NOT By RIPLEY **NEW DEAL PARTY**

He told the Executives club they are "lederalization of all power, disregate for individual freedom, delegation of all legislative power to executive bureaus, and solving all problems by federal spending." He added that Americans "are submitting ourselves voluntarily to Fascist controls " Taft said the totalitation tend-

ncy to rely upon the federal government "has permeated all the people of the United States, even hose who say they are against it He said the demand for govern ment, aid was noticeable in local post-war planning, adding that 'every city in the country is making vast plans for public works and they all seem to think the federal government is going to finance

Asserting that such spending

was stopped long before the war, he said he had "no idea" why we believed it would be resumed. He continued in the same vein, saying agriculture is always asking congress for federal funds, and that small business wants a law passed for loans to small business. Taft said he advocated state administered and financed social welfare and public housing programs "with a little help" from the federal government.

He said all the states were operating on a surplus basis, but that the federal government was running at a deficit of \$60,000,000,000

The Ohio congressman said he had heard a "great deal" of talk about a shortage of working capital, but he was convinced that if the government would see that industry receives cash for assets frozen by the war effort, there would be enough cash for private capital to proceed.

America's post war effort, he said, is full employment thru private enterprise.
