Uncle Ray's Corner

CORN PLANT PRODUCES FOOD, GLUE, SYRUP AND ALCOHOL

Indian corn, or maize, now grows in many parts of the world. Besides the United States, the important corn-growing countries are Argentina, Russia, Rumania, Yugoslavia, Italy, Mexico, Hungary, India and Egypt. Canada grows some corn, but not a great deal; what is the most important Canadian grain crop.

One American state — Iowa — grows more than any country outside the United States. Last year it produced close to 250 bushels of corn for each man, woman and child in the state.

Illinois, Nebraska, Minnesota, Indiana, Ohio, Missouri and Wisconsin are the other American states which produced more than 100,000,000 bushels in 1943.

It has been said that most corn is "sold in the form of meat." This means that the grain is fed to livestock, and the animals are sold to meatpacking companies. "Corn-fed hogs" are well known.

About one-fifth of the corn goes to market for use as food for people. Thus we have corn meal, for the making of corn bread, a food which has been a staple of the people since the first days of the settlement. People also eat millions of cans of corn. The corn used for canning is cut from young ears.

All parts of the corn plant can be used in the greatest number of ways. "Corn oil" is taken from it, and this is used in cooking various soaps and into varnish. Some exerts on lead pencils and some sponges which look like red rubber, are made largely from corn oil.

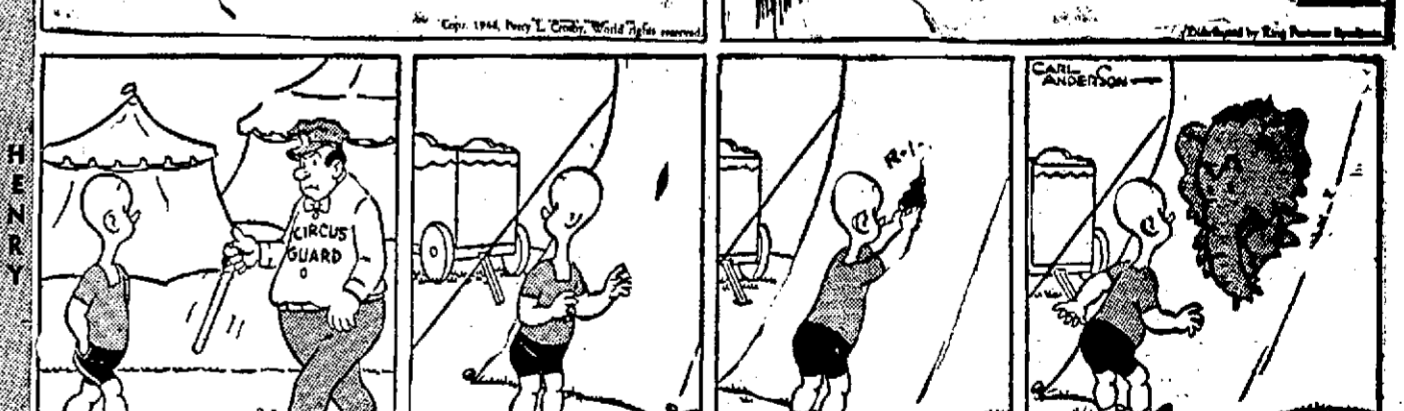
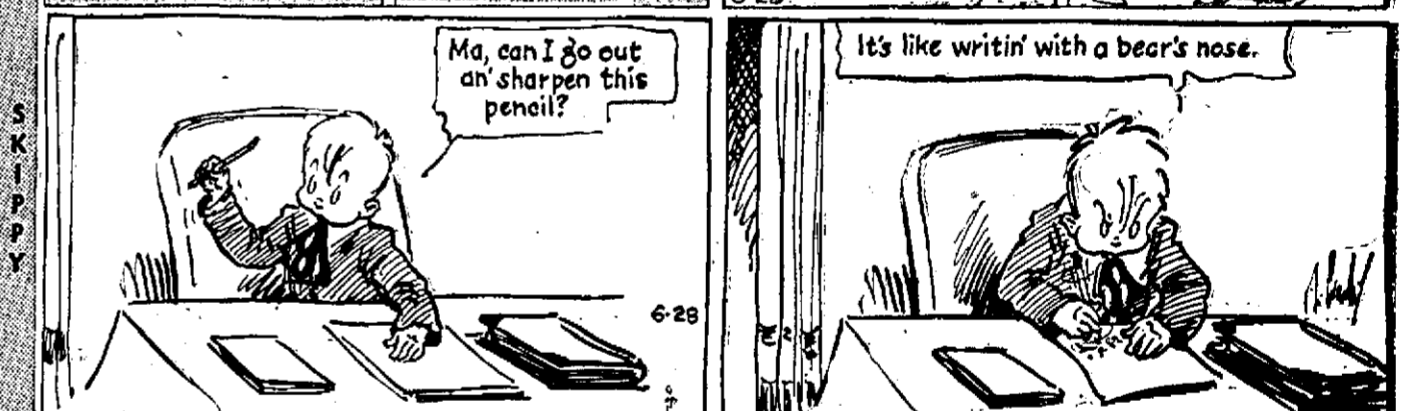
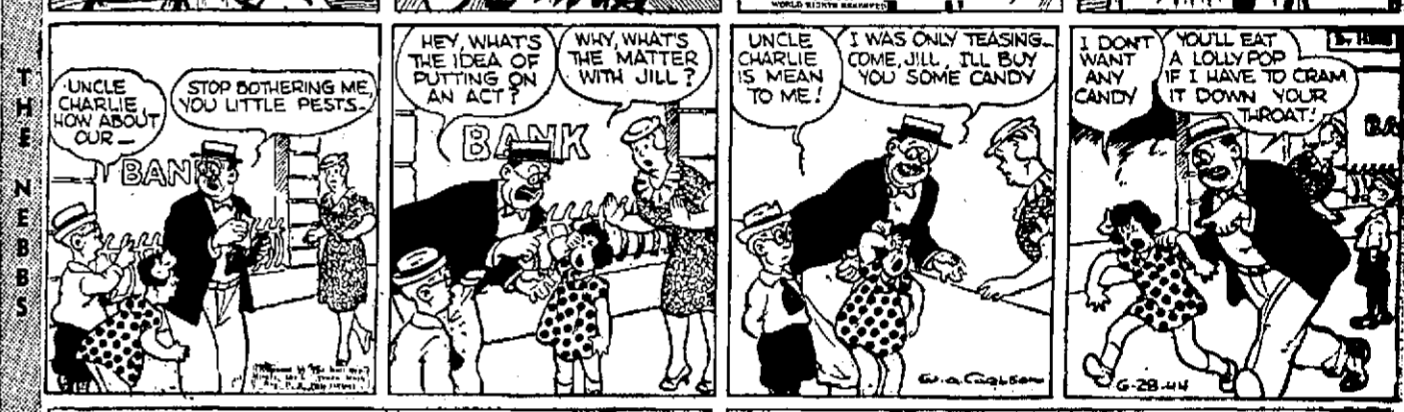
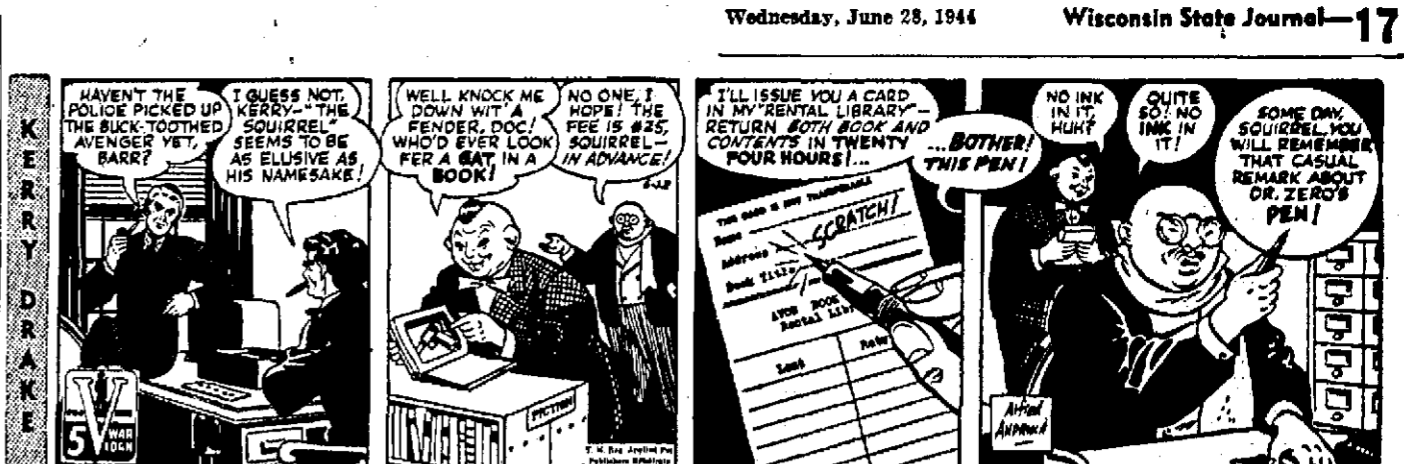
All parts of the corn plant can be turned into products of value. Alcohol is taken from cornstalks, and in the future such alcohol may become the chief fuel for automobiles. When oil wells run dry, or perhaps before that happens, we shall be able to turn to corn-stalk alcohol to make our cars run.

Among the other products of corn plants are glue, hair cream, mats and corn syrup. The gum
