

"March Of Time" Dramatizes Post-War Problem Thursday

Departing from the usual format, the March of Time Thursday will devote its entire half-hour program to one of America's major problems, the future of more than 10,000,000 men and women who will be discharged from the armed services after the war. The broadcast, over WEAF at 10:30 p. m., EWT, will dramatize the study of this problem made by Time and Life Correspondent John Hersey. Called "Joe In Home Now," it is based on the actual history of servicemen already returned to civilian life. The program is subject to last-minute cancellation should WEAF be broadcasting the GOP national convention at that time, and after the Thursday night the March of Time goes off the air for one month, returning to WEAF at 10:30 p. m., EWT, Thursday, Aug. 3.

A bag of gum drops leads the way to the killer in the National Safety Council's mystery drama, "It's Murder!" Thursday at 10:15 p. m., EWT, over WJZ.

In the story, Rex Starr, retired actor and amateur criminologist, is accompanying his Broadway-columnist niece, Joan Adams, to an interview with a new musical comedy star when the two stumble

upon a murder. The new star, it develops, is involved in the case, and Rex and Joan do their usual sleuthing in discovering it.

Roy Rogers, the No. 1 singing cowboy, will be the visiting guest star with Bing Crosby on his Music Hall show Thursday, at 9 p. m., EWT, over WEAF. Marilyn Maxwell and "Ukie" Sherin will aid "The Groaner" with the guest greetings.

Four noted authorities will discuss "Should Defeated Germany Be Allowed Immediate Self-Government?" on "America's Town Meeting of the Air" on Thursday, at 8:30 p. m., EWT, over WJZ.

They are Paul Hagen, author of "Germany After Hitler," and one of the founders of the Council for Democratic Germany, affirmative; Prof. Karl M. Arndt, assistant professor of economics at the University of Nebraska, affirmative; Emil Ludwig, biographer and historian, negative, and Carroll Binder, foreign editor and director of foreign service of the Chicago Daily News, also negative.

PLAN ELECTION FOR ORGANIZING CAFETERIA HELP

Election to determine the bargaining agent for approximately 60 employees of the A. G. Vandemark Co., operating the cafeteria at the Ohio Steel Foundry Co. here, has been set by the National Labor Relations Board to be conducted July 7.

The election which will determine whether the employees will be represented by the United Service Workers, Local Industrial Union, No. 1378, CIO, or by no union, was authorized by the NLRB with consent of Vandemark who operates the company.

Issues involving determination of bargaining agent and duration of contract were taken under advisement by the NLRB after a hearing Tuesday at the West Ohio Gas Co. office. The matter which involves some 35 physical workers of the company, members of The Gas, Coke and Chemical Workers' CIO local, includes several legal angles which will be clarified by the NLRB.

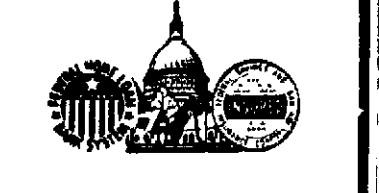
