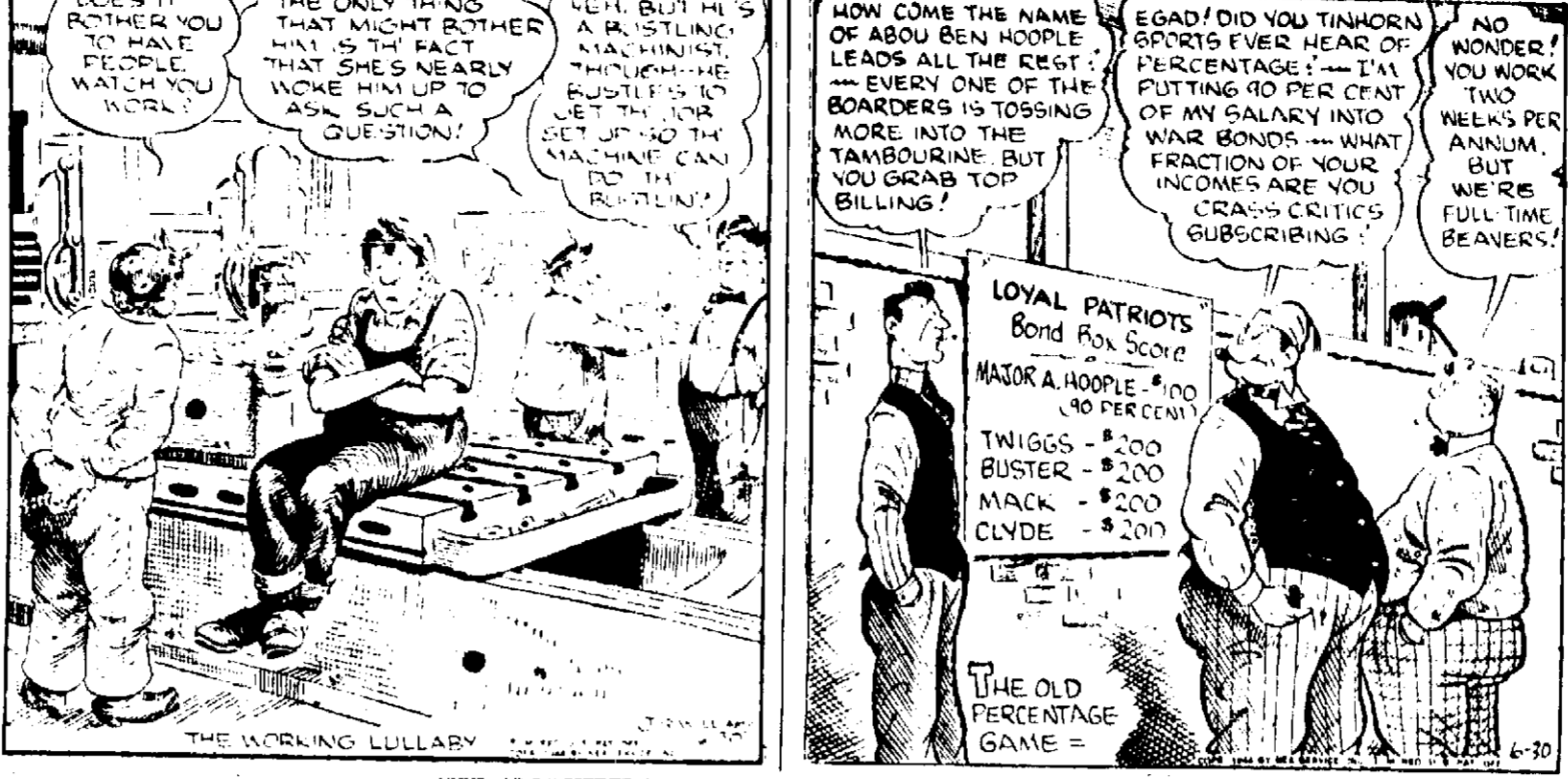
DEATH OF FLIER IS REPORTED

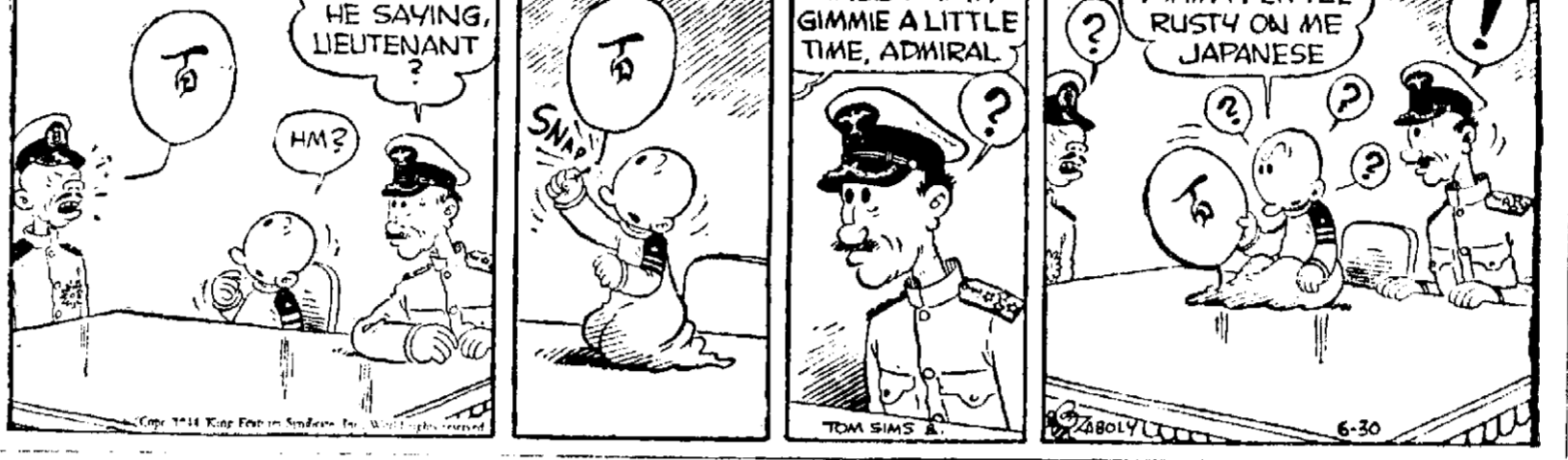

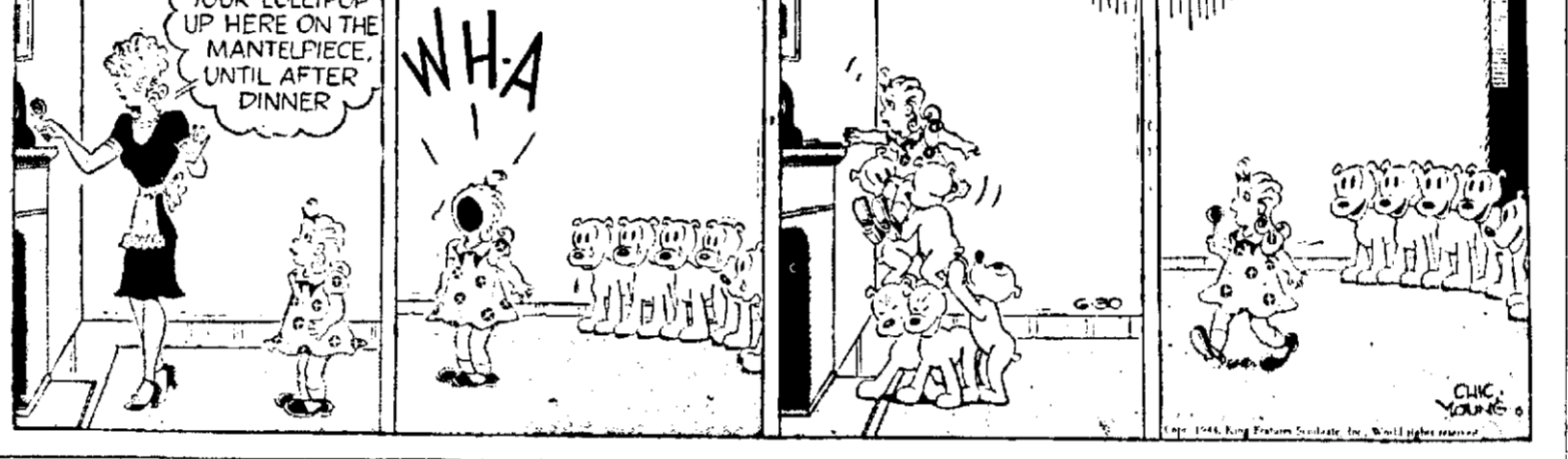

WASHINGTON, June 30—(AP)—American casualties in the war, including the first two weeks of battle in Normandy, total 244,158. Of these, 55,205 are dead—25,104 Army, not including those in France, showed an increase of 1,346 since Stimson's report of a week ago which covered the period through June 6. There was an increase of 735 dead and 2,236 wounded.

The Navy casualty list was 368 above a week ago, with 58 more dead and 297 wounded.
