WASHINGTON - (U.P.) - The navy revealed Friday that army, navy, and marine corps fliers have destroyed at least 12,086 Japanese planes in the air or on the ground since Pearl Harbor at a loss of 2,726 American planes—a victory ratio of almost five to one. Of the 12,086 enemy planes de-

The figures, covering the period from Dec. 7, 1941, to May 1, 1944, do not include enemy ground losses fr 1942 or 1943, nor enemy losses to antiaircraft fire.

The navy said that 65 per cent of all its airmen shot down have been rescued.

# **U. S. Traffic Toll Increases 11%**

9,400 Deaths May 31 CHICAGO - (U.P) - The National Safety council reported Friday that the traffic death toll for the first five months of this year was 11 per cent, or nearly 1,000 lives, higher than the same period

Safety Council Lists

in 1943. There were 9,400 traffic deaths from Jan. 1 to May 31, this year, compared to 8,440 for the same period in 1943 and 13,914 for the first five months of 1941, the council reported.

While the figures showed an increase of 11 per cent between this year and last year, traffic deaths for the first five months of 1944 were 33 per cent below the January-May, 1941, figure. Col. John Stilwell, president of

the council, said that the traffic situation is serious as the nation is entering its peak traffic fatality season, which usually begins with Independence day and extends through the vaction months into October.

Traffic deaths for May, 1944, per cent over the 1,770 in May, 1943. numbered 1,800, an increase of 2 Traffic fatalities in 402 cities

reporting to the council were 3

per cent greater than in the first five months of 1943, but the total for all reporting cities in May was 22 per cent below May of last year. Cities of more than 250,000 population reporting fewer fatalities for January-May, 1944, than for the corresponding period in 1943 included Milwaukee, with a 25 per cent reduction.
