### PENICILLIN SPEEDED IN DRYING BY RADIO

NEW YORK, July 8-(UP)-Penicillin production has been speeded up by 24 hours time thru a cooking-by-radio process that has replaced a freeze-drying method

According to Radio Corp. America, which has perfected the new system, heat generated by radio currents now can accomplish in 30 minutes what it took a freeze-hydrator 24 hours. The electronic method of drying the infection-killing drug is also far cheaper, it was said.

Dehydration is vital to penicillin production as a bulk reducer. After penicilin is grown and purified, approximately 90 per cent of the water is removed, increasing the potency of the drug from 40,000 units a cubic centimeter to 100,000 units. Freeze-drying still will be used to powder the drug in ampoules or vials for shipment.


