Erzo Pinza, noted basso of the opera and concert stage and recent Lima guest, returns as guest soloist on the "Great Artists Series" Monday over WEAF at 9 p. m. EWT. Donald Voorhees conducts the orchestra.

Pinza sings two of his most applauded operatic arias, "Non Piu Andrai" from the "Marriage of Figaro" by Mozart and "Il Lacerato Spirito" from "Simon Boccanegra".

His other selection is the popular Latin American ballad "Besame Mucho" by Velazquez.

**SPECIAL TRAINS TO BE ALLOWED FOR CANDIDATES**

WASHINGTON, July 10—(AP)—President Roosevelt can have a special campaign train if he is nominated and chooses to tour the country by rail.

But in that case, an ODT spokesman said today in response to an inquiry, Republican Candidate Thomas E. Dewey can have one too.

New regulations restricting the government use of special train and cars, effective Monday, make exceptions "for the exclusive use of the President of the United States."

The ODT spokesman said, "the ODT does not discriminate between candidates. But we don't expect much campaigning by rail-road this fall."

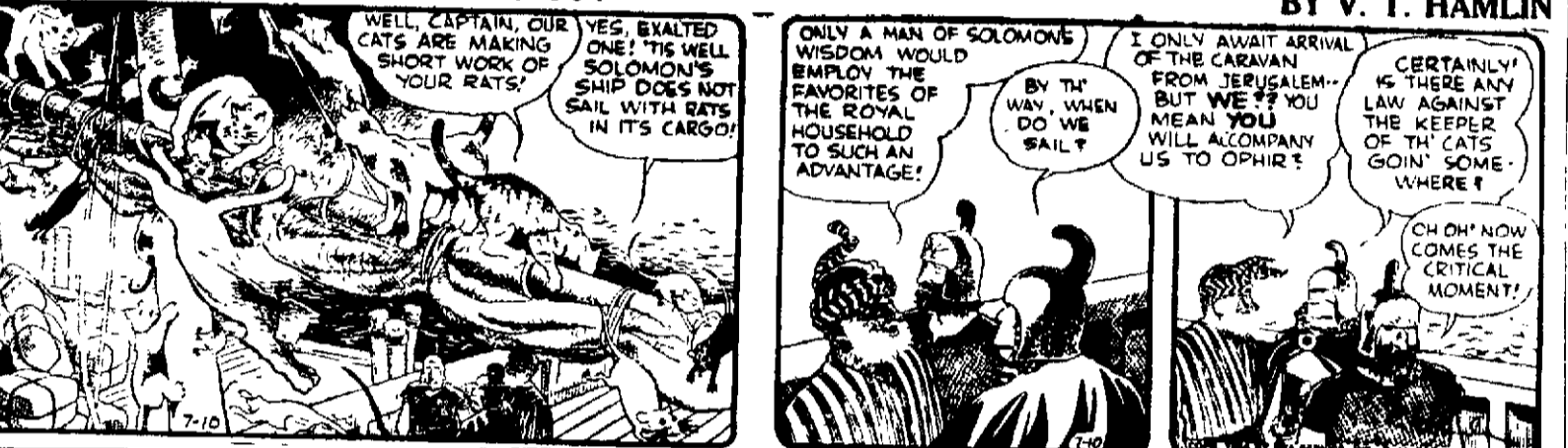

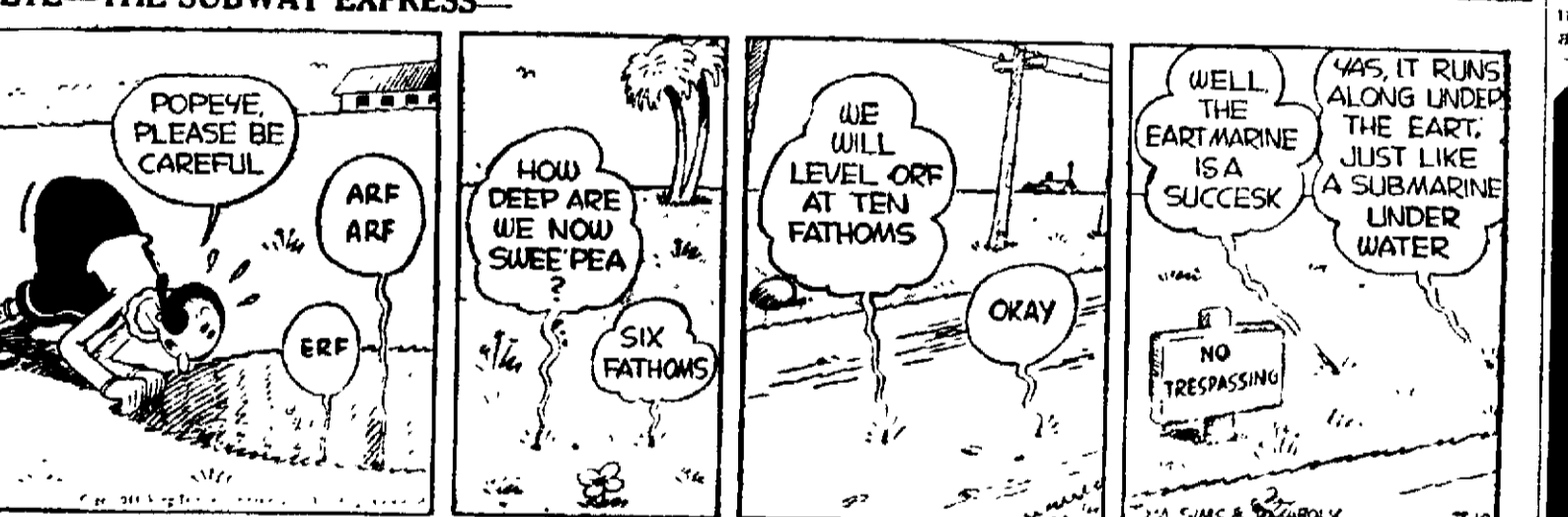
