the white surface of the head. In the dragonfly eyes there are close to 30,000 separate units. In other words, the eyes are "compound" and are divided into many little parts.

Other insects have compound eyes which do not have so many parts or "units." Some ants have only 50 units in their eyes. A housefly has about 4,000 units in its eyes.

On the floor of the sea are animals with no eyes at all. The clam and the oyster are among those with no power of seeing.

Crabs and lobsters, on the other hand, have eyes which are well developed. In some cases, but not all, these eyes are raised on rather high stalks.

The "sentinel crab" is one of those with eyes on high stalks. It can look in any direction—forward, backward or sidewise. The action of the stalks may be compared to that of a swivel chair which can be turned in any direction.

As examples of animals without eyes, we may mention spiders and certain insects, which can eat and have some sense, touch but no sight.

Other animals have a dim sense of sight. There are "eyespots" on a starfish, but it seems they do no more than tell the starfish whether it is light or darkness.

Thousands of other kinds of animals can see well enough. These include furry animals, fish, birds and a vast number of insects.

The eyes of the dragonfly are large compared to the rest of the head. They make up about two-thirds of the whole surface of the head! In the dragonfly eyes there are close to 30,000 separate units. In other words, the eyes are "compound" and are divided into many little parts.
