## JENKINS HINTED AS SUCCESSOR TO GOP LEADER

WASHINGTON, July 14—(AP)—Congressman Thomas A. Jenkins of Ironton, O., was mentioned today as a possible successor to Rep. Joseph Martin of Massachusetts as Republican leader of the house should the GOP gain control in the November elections and elevate Martin to the speakership.

All congressmen discussed in the quiet, behind-the-scenes context are mid-westerners. In addition to Jenkins they are Reps. Charles Halleck of Indiana and Earl C. Michener of Michigan.

Each reportedly would have the solid support of Republican members from his own state. In the light of his popularity with national leaders, Halleck some months ago was given the inside track, but lately Jenkins and Michener are reported to have won the support of elder house members who have since suggested either man has the training and temperament for the job.

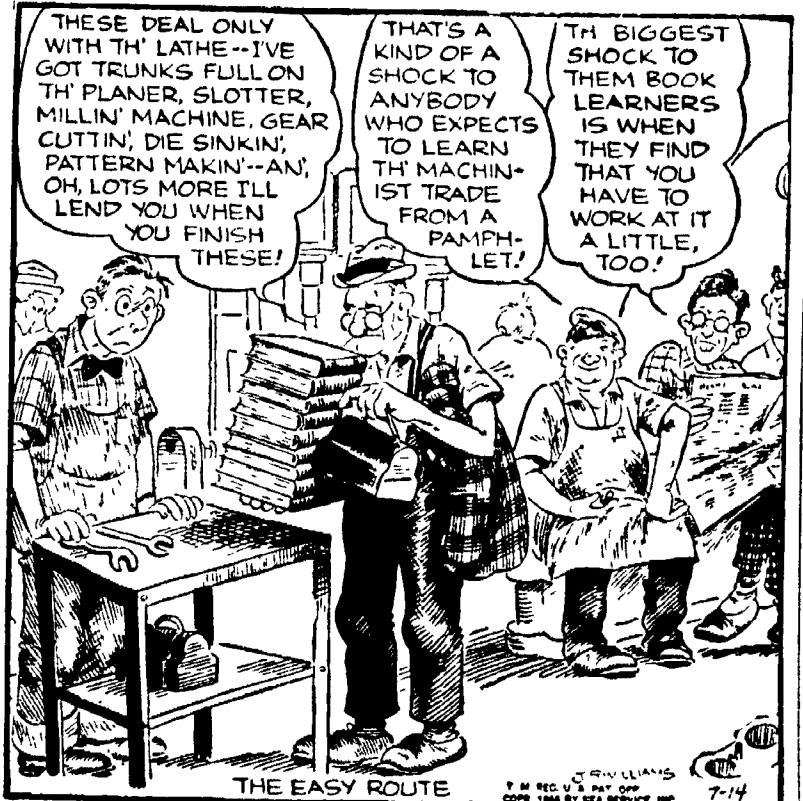
## HOTEL STRIKE ENDED

AKRON, O., July 14—(AP)—An eight-day, strike at Akron's largest hotel, the Mayflower, ended last night when 70 employees returned to work, Charles E. Raleigh, organizer for the AFL-Hotel and Restaurant Employees and Bartenders Union, reported. Raleigh said the employees walked out during a dispute between the AFL group and the CIO United Service Workers Union, which sought to establish bargaining rights at the hotel.

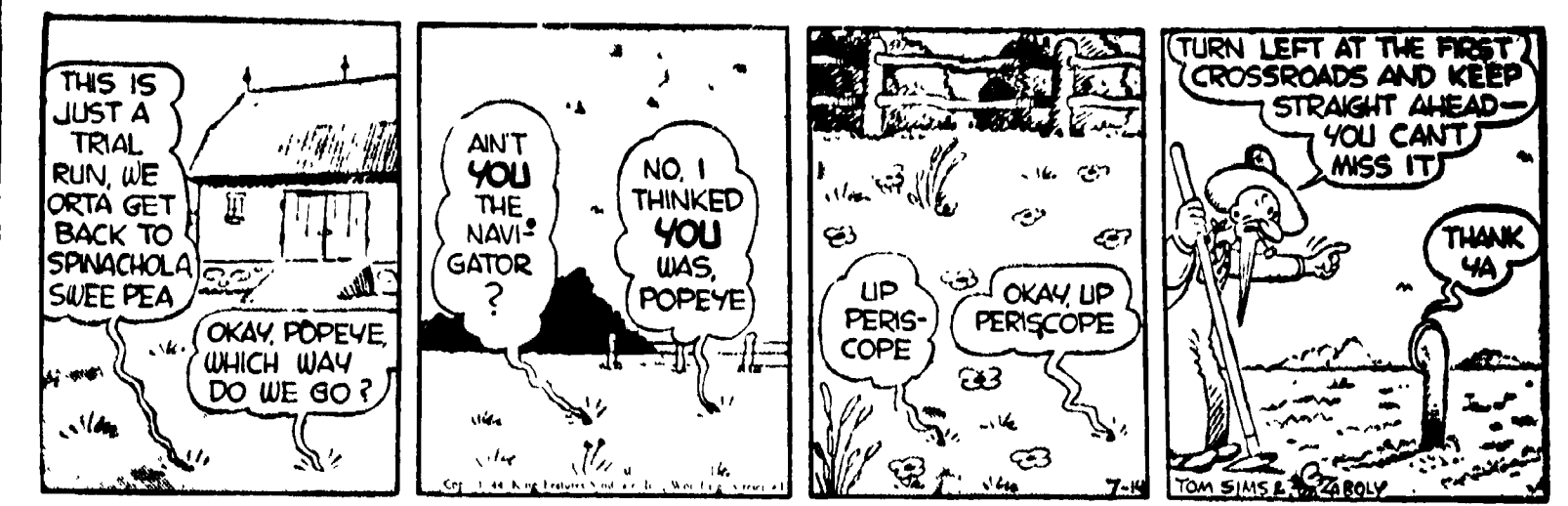
## CASUALTIES HIT 187,028 TOTAL

WASHINGTON, July 14—(INS)—American Army casualties thru June 20 were placed today by Acting Secretary of War Patterson at 187,028 killed, wounded, missing and prisoners.

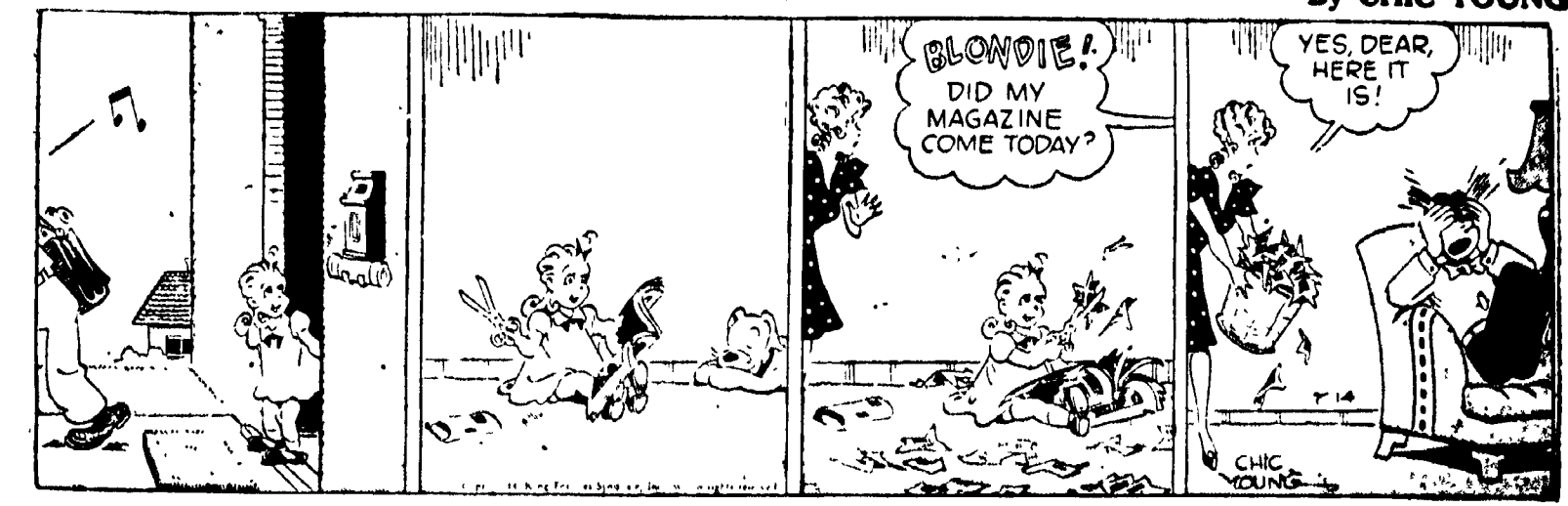
The total included 33,240 killed, 177,449 wounded, 38,142 missing and 38,197 prisoners.

Patterson said the total included very few of the casualties suffered on the Normandy beachhead. American Army casualties in Italy thru June 3 were placed at 12,655 killed, 47,457 wounded, and 10,287 missing—a total of 70,399.

## LIBRARY BOARD FILLS VACANCIES

## NAZIS MASSACRE POPULATION OF FRENCH VILLAGE

LONDON, July 14—(AP)—The French press service said last night nearly 800 persons were massacred June 10 by the Germans in the village of Oradour Sur Glane, Central France. It said the men were shot, and the women and children died inside a locked church which first was dismantled and then set afire.

Only "seven or eight" of the town's population escaped, the agency said, and all buildings were burned.

There were contradictory reports as to the reason for the German act.

"Some say an arms dump was found in the village, others that some Germans were killed there," the agency said.

The press service reported German troops arrived in the village at 1:30 p. m. and the commander directed that the entire population assemble on the airgrounds. The men were marched away in small groups and shot. The women and children then were herded into the church for slaughter.

Aerial balloons were used in the Franco-German war in 1870.

## CHILD DROWNS IN CREEK

SPRINGFIELD, O., July 14—(AP)—Thalma Joan Farley, 10, of Dayton, drowned in a creek near Moorefield yesterday.
