'ARMY SETS UP PROGRAM FOR TOOL SALVAGE

(UP)-The St. Louis Ordnance Depot has been made the national center for tool reclamation under a new plan likely to save the taxpayers from 30 to 50 million dollars a year, the Ordnance Department announced recently thru Maj. A. H. Gardner, Jr., commanding officer of the Lake City Ordnance Plant near here. Troop units about to be sent

abroad surrender the tools they have used in training and are issued factory-new equipment upon arrival overseas. Under the previous set-up, tools left behind were scattered among various ordnance depots for reclamation. Central-, ization of reclamation in St. Louis not only will affect large monetary savings, Maj. Gardner pointed out, but will forestall consumption of critical man hours and materials in the manufacture of new

The new plan provides that all tools left behind in Army camps by troops sent overseas shall be gathered up and rushed to the St. Louis Ordnance Depot to be **cleaned.** repaired, reconditioned. and made virtually as good as new. The value of tools already relaimed by ordnance in the first three weeks under the St. Louis plan exceeded one million dollars. Expert Says Season Now Too Late Also For Carrots In Northern Ohio

COLUMBUS, O., July 15 (AP) -Much as it may be the dish you like best, it won't do much good to plant any more sweet corn in Central and Northern Ohio this year, an expert said today.

And the same goes for carrots, asserted H. D. Brown, professor of vegetable gardening at Ohio State university. "It's too late to plant any kind; of sweet corn and expect it to mature before cold weather," Brown

said, "and as far as carrots are encerned, most victory gardeners I'LL WALK ALONE and IT will be wasting their seed to plant it now. Unless they have irrigation, carrots will not mature and my advice would be not to plant them any more in central and Northern Obio."
