

Young Girl's First Love Is Portrayed At Sigma

PLEA TO TERMINATE HEARING IS DENIED

WASHINGTON, July 18.—(INS)—Chief Justice Edward C. Eicher today denied a motion seeking to end the mass sedition trial—made by a defense lawyer who charged that proceedings are "more or less in a condition of chaos."

P. Bateman Ennis, counsel for Gerhard Kunze, asserted that coverage of three defendants and other developments would "create prejudicial speculation" by jurors.

Meanwhile, defense lawyers were assigned by the court to represent Eugene Sanctuary, whose lawyer "quit" the case and Ernest Elmhurst, who objected to appointment of his lawyer to represent Edward J. Smythe. Both defendants objected, demanding as their counsel James J. Laughlin, the "ousted" lawyer.

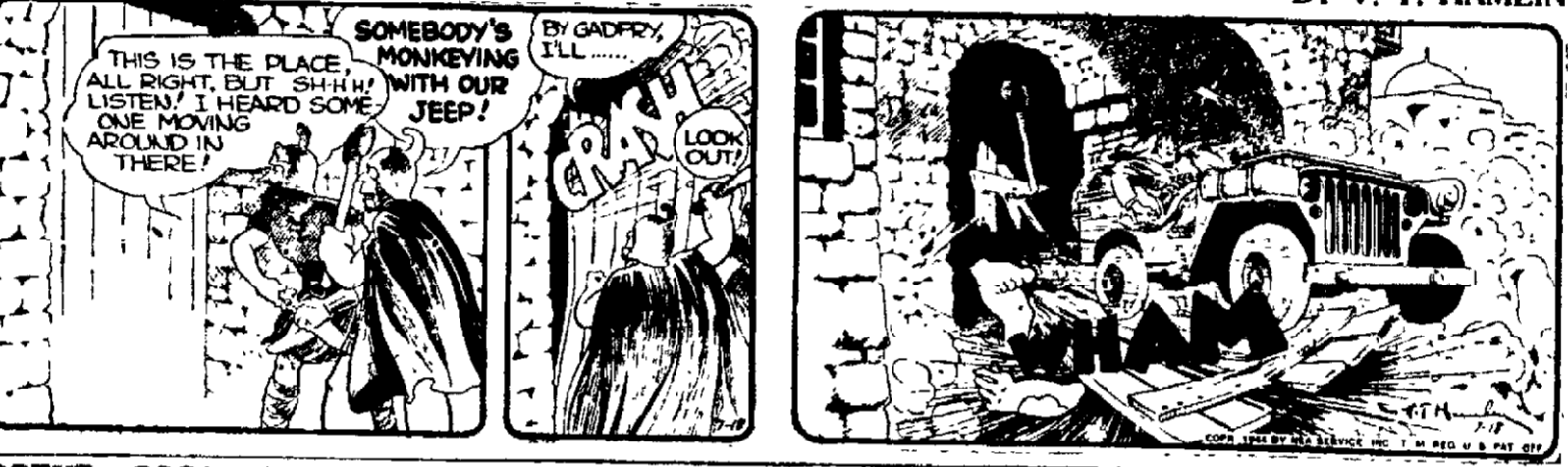

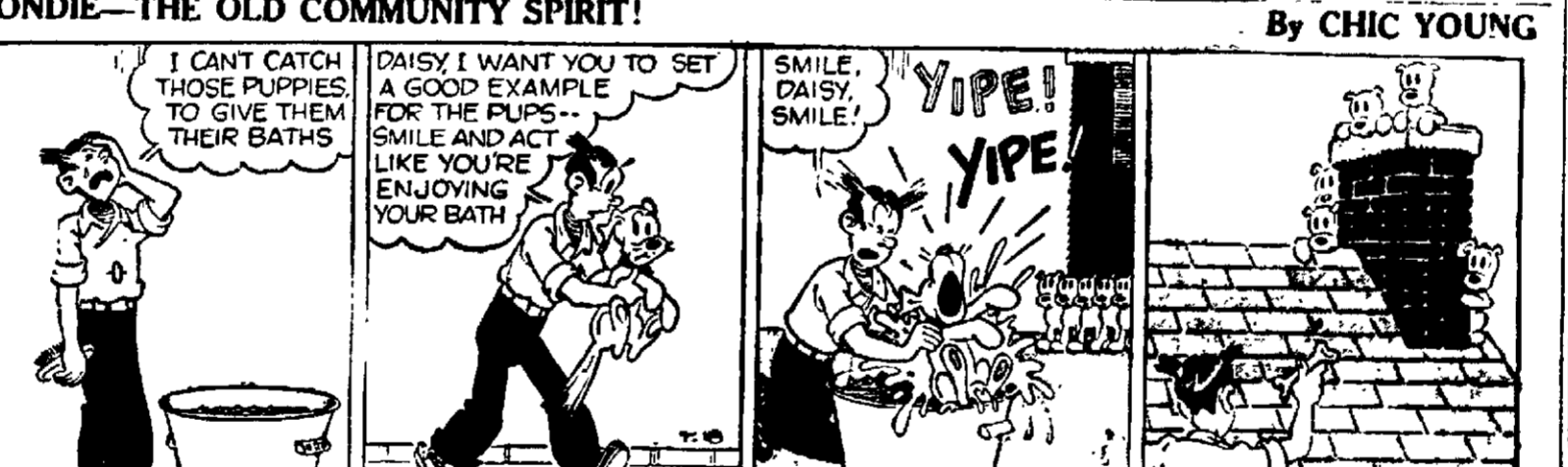

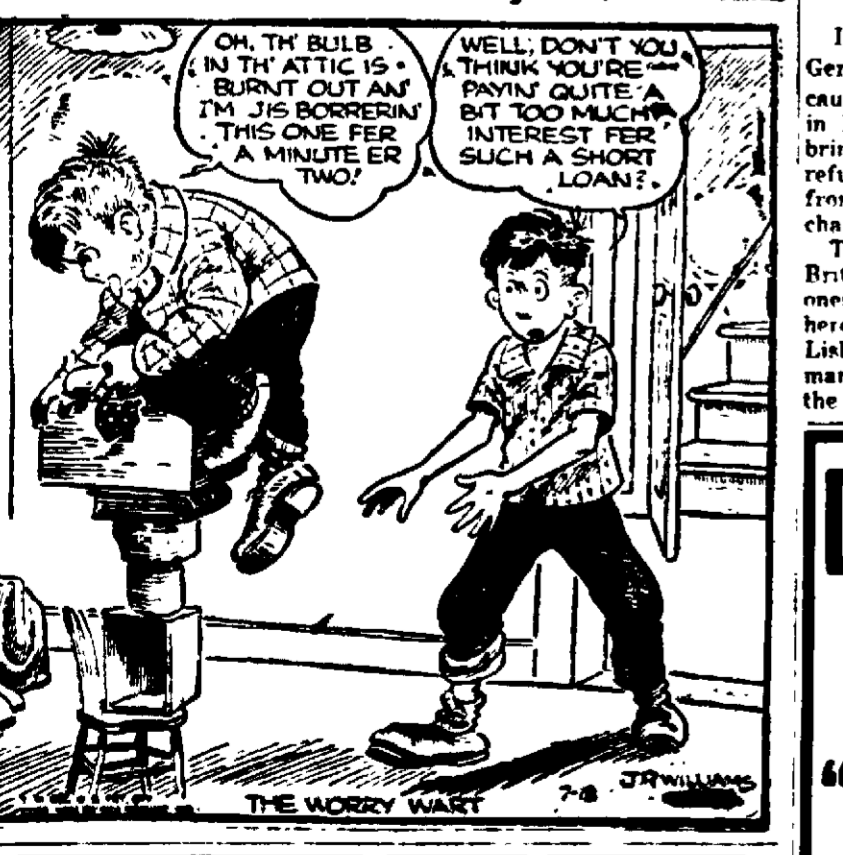

BOMBED RAIL LINES DELAY EXCHANGE

IRUN, Spain, July 18.—(AP)—Germans admitted today that because of badly-disrupted rail lines in France they may be unable to bring three trainloads of British refugees to the French-Spanish frontier for a British-German exchange of interned nationals.

The three trains carrying 900 British civilians and war prisoners from Germany were due here last Tuesday en route to Lisbon for exchange with Germans who arrived there aboard the liner Drottningholm July 11.
