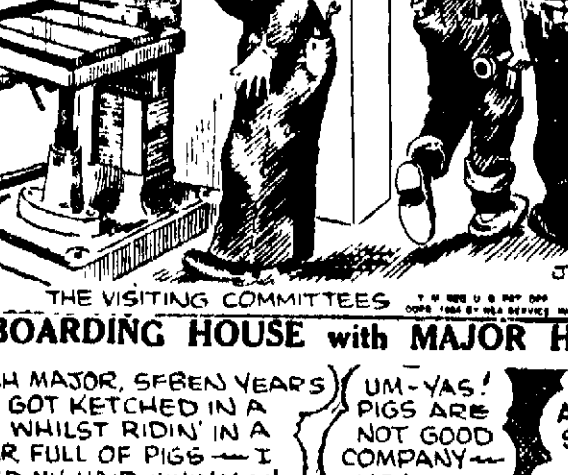

## TWO CANNERIES ARE MERGED

**CELINA, July 21**—Crampton Canning, Inc. and Stokely Bros. and Co. of Indianapolis, have merged. H. F. Krimendahl, president of the Celina concern announced Thursday after all Crampton stockholders voted approval of the merger. The majority of Crampton stock is locally owned. The combination which was brought about by a stock merger, was accomplished because Stokely's desired additional food products for their nationally advertised line of foods. Krimendahl said, the Indiana concern operates from Hawaii to Florida packing fruits and vegetables, as well as frozen foods. All present personnel of Crampton's will continue in their present capacities and the merger will in no way affect Crampton contracts with growers. Krimendahl said, adding that he would remain as general manager of the Stokely's Ohio to Michigan interests. Included in the merger is Crampton's controlling interests in the W. R. Beach Co., canning plants in Michigan. Since 1899, Crampton has packed vegetables and have added 16 plants to the home concern, located in Celina.

**ST. MARYS, July 21**—Mr. and Mrs. William Schelle, received news Thursday of the death of their son, Pvt. Vernon E. Schelle, with the U. S. Army in France. Leland, Langley field, Va.; Lloyd, St. Marys; Jack at home, and Mrs. Harry Wisewille, Spencerville.
