Twill ponchos, insect netting, thick net hammocks, and taffeta sleeping bags will keep nylon fabricators humming for the rest of the year.

United Kingdom research workers have found a way to shrink-proof wool, so you may be able to wash wool clothes like cottons before long. . . OPA has put in nationwide ceiling prices on alfalfa as a foresighted measure to prevent price rises on meat.

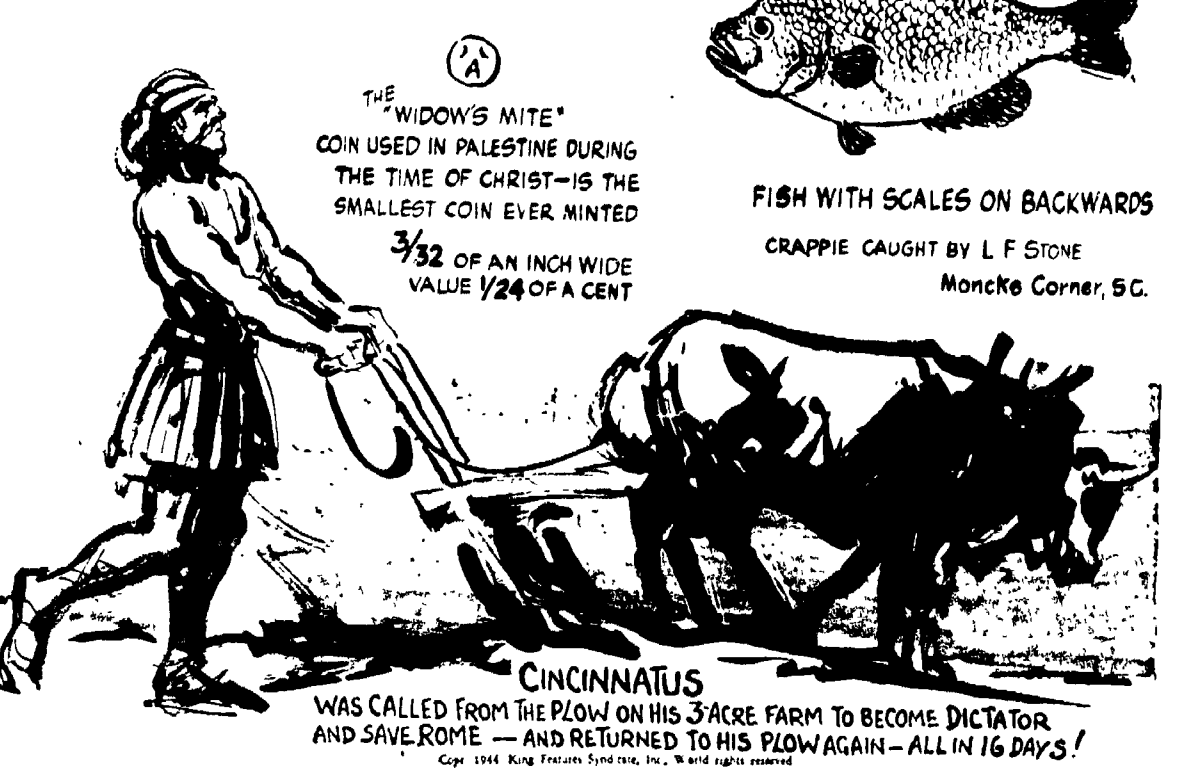
