## 59 NAZI PLANES SHOT DOWN BY RUSSIAN ACE

BUFFALO, N. Y., July 28 (UP)—Lt. Col. Alexander Pokryshkin, leading ace has brought down 59 German planes, more than double the number bagged by America's No. 1 ace, it was revealed today in a letter to Bell Aircraft from Lt. Gen. L. G. Rudenko of the Soviet embassy in Washington.

The Russian flier, the letter said, shot down 48 Nazi planes with his Bell Airacobras. German propagandists have credited some Nazi pilots with more than 60 kills, but top British aces have victories in the thirties and the top American flier has 28.

In his letter to Lawrence D. Bell, president of Bell Aircraft at Buffalo, Rudenko named 10 Russian fliers, who have shot down 20 or more planes with Airacobras.

For some time it had been known that half the airplanes sent to Russia under lend-lease arrangements were Airacobras, but the letter was the first authoritative report of their performance.

## LT. GEN. M'NAIR 5TH U. S. GENERAL KILLED IN ACTION

WASHINGTON, July 28 (INS)—Lt. Gen. Lesley J. McNair was the fifth American general killed in action since the outbreak of war.

The others were: Major Gen. Clarence M. Tinker, lost during the battle of Midway; Brig. Gen. Asa Duncan, declared dead after disappearing off the European coast; Brig. Gen. Don Pratt, killed in France, and Brig. Gen. Nelson Walker, who died of wounds in France.

In addition, seven American generals have been killed in airplane crashes and one died as the result of exposure in action.

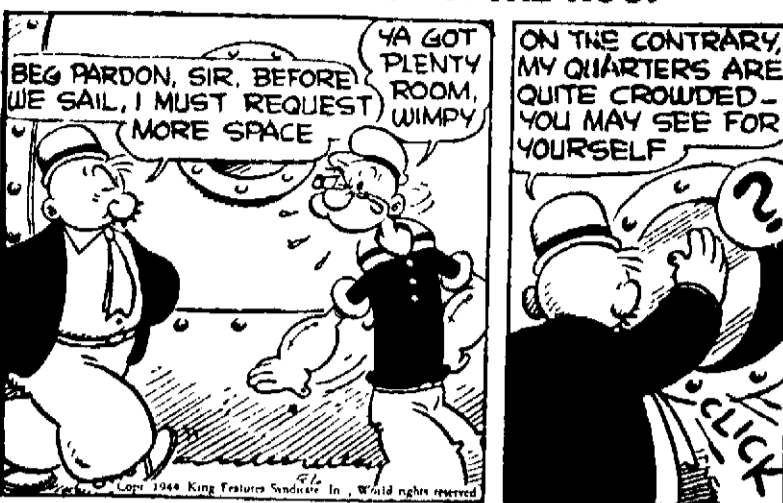
Six other generals are listed by the War Department as missing in action and 19 are in Japanese prison camps.

More than 2500 man-hours a year are expected to be saved by a new tire locking press designed to mount heavy military truck tires, with one operator doing work formerly required of five.

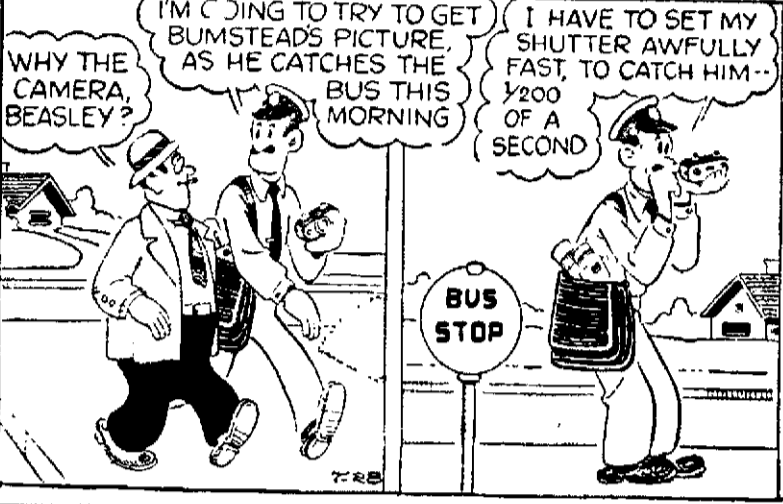

## WLB ENFORCES GUILD RULING ON UP EMPLOYEES

NEW YORK, July 28 (AP)—The United Press and the American Newspaper Guild (CIO) Thursday announced receipt of a directive from the National War Labor Board daily newspaper, printing and publishing commission, instructing the United Press to institute maintenance of union membership among its editorial employees in the United States.

The Guild, which represents United Press editorial employees in collective bargaining, had sought the order. At a hearing before the commission in Chicago recently the UP unsuccessfully defended its opposition to "any and all forms of enforced union membership for its editorial employees."

The news agency has 14 days in which to petition the National War Labor Board for a review.

The directive orders UP to incorporate the maintenance of membership provision in a signed agreement.

Attached to the directive was a dissenting opinion by Frank Ahlgren, editor of the Memphis Tenn. Commercial Appeal who was the industry member of the commission in this case. Joining in the majority report were F. S. Diebler, public member and vice chairman of the commission, and Sam Eubanks, labor member and executive vice president of the American Newspaper Guild.

The maintenance of membership provision requires that all employees who are members of the union in good standing 15 days after the date of the directive must maintain membership during the life of the agreement. Non-members are not required to join the union and union members may withdraw within the 15-day period.

## CIRCUS TO REOPEN SUMMER SCHEDULE

SARASOTA, Fla., July 28 (AP)—Ringling Bros. and Barnum & Bailey circus will open next Monday in Akron, O., using the Rubber Bowl, George Smith, general manager, said last night. The show has been in winter quarters here since shortly after the big top was destroyed by fire July 6 with the loss of 160 lives.

Smith said all canvas to be used had been fireproofed, and final tests had been made yesterday.

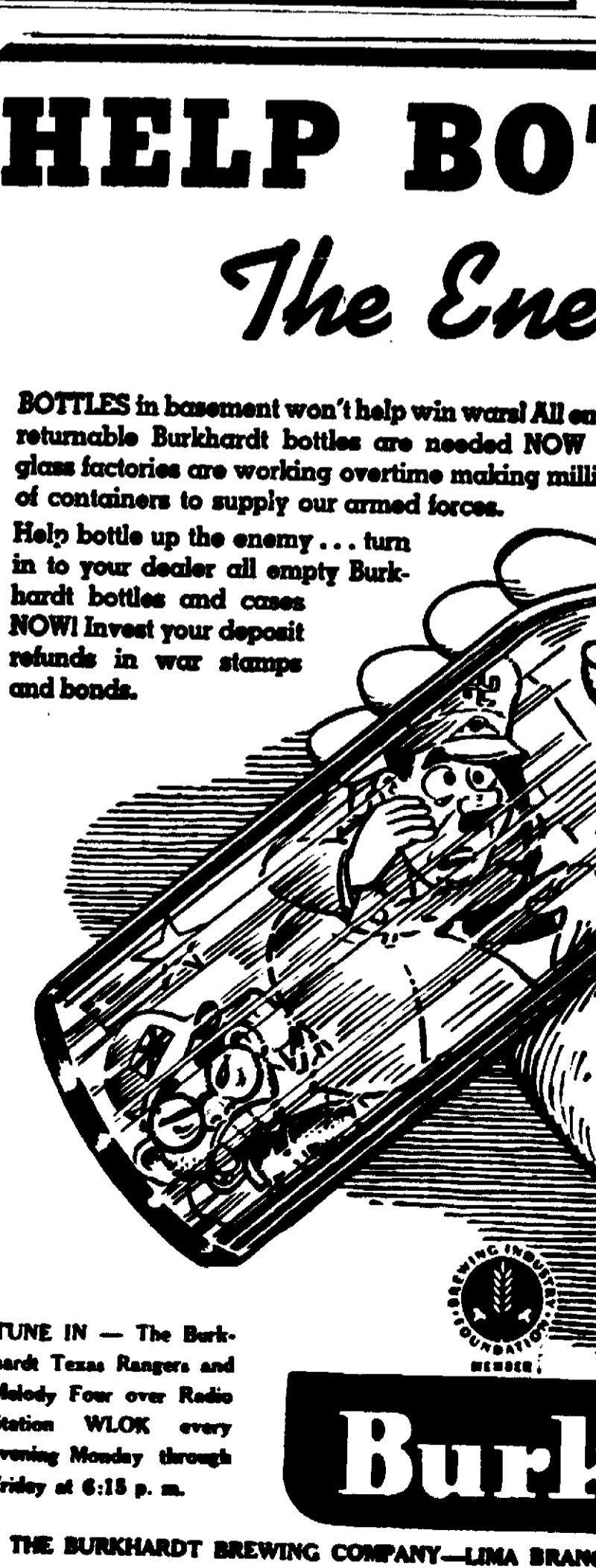

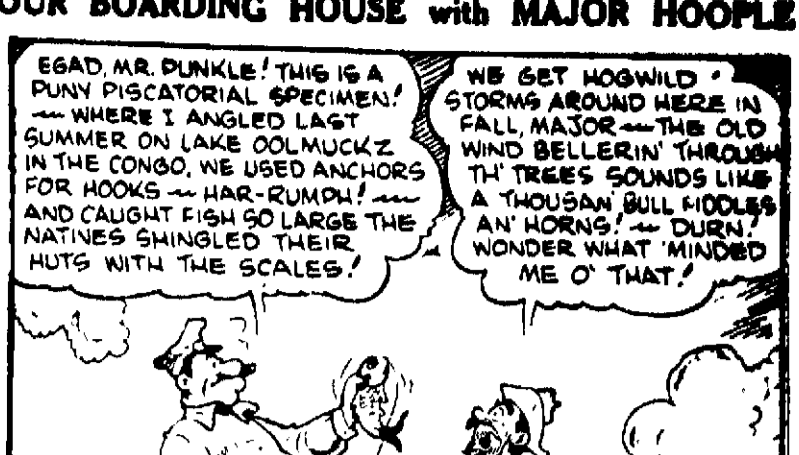
