Freak Accident Kills Mother of Two

MINNEAPOLIS — (AP) — Mrs. Marion Revak, attractive 25-year-old mother of two, was killed late Monday when an overcharge of electricity tore off the four blades of an automobile fan, driving one of them into her jugular vein.
Her husband, George, 31, had been repairing the fan and plugged it into a socket just as Mrs. Revak stepped back into the room.
The overload, caused by 110 volts in place of storage battery voltage, sent two of the blades careening off, the third into Mrs. Revak's throat and the fourth into Revak's right arm, causing a severe flesh wound.

Uncle Ray's Corner
Cody Became Rider For Pony Express At Age of Fourteen
Heleen Cody, a sister of Buffalo Bill, told about her 11-year-old brother's feelings after he shot and killed an Indian. She said that he felt sad, and could not understand why the men in the party raised a cheer for him. Yet he believed that it had been the only thing to do. If he had not fired his rifle, the Indian might have shot one of the cattle men. The members of the party were glad when they got back to Fort Leavenworth. The Indians had fired many arrows at them, and several had been wounded, but the only white men who suffered death were the three who had fallen during the first Indian attack.
The Indians had driven the cattle into a stampede, and all of the animals had been lost. It was supposed that some cattle took up a wild life on the plains, perhaps joining a buffalo herd.
Will found himself quite a hero in his home in Salt Creek Valley. Some persons spoke of him as "the boy Indian killer."
Isaac Cody, his father had died and the family had to get along as well as possible on the farm. Will was employed by a company to help guard herds of cattle which were being sent westward. For this work he was paid as much as \$40 a month, and he gave most of it to his mother.
During a few months taken from his work, the boy went to school. He failed to shine in the classroom, however, and went back to the task of watching cattle.
After reaching the age of 14, young Cody had a new adventure. He became a rider for the "pony express!"
Most of those who rode in the pony express were well-grown men, but this husky boy was taken on for a trial. Soon he proved that he was as good a rider as the men. The pony express was a mail service which ran from St. Joseph, Mo., to Sacramento, Calif. It was opened in 1860.
Each rider was given a stretch of about 45 miles to cover, carrying "Indian ponies" twice along the way. Cody carried letters and small packages on the route for more than three months. The whole trip of 1,960 miles was made in 10 days.
