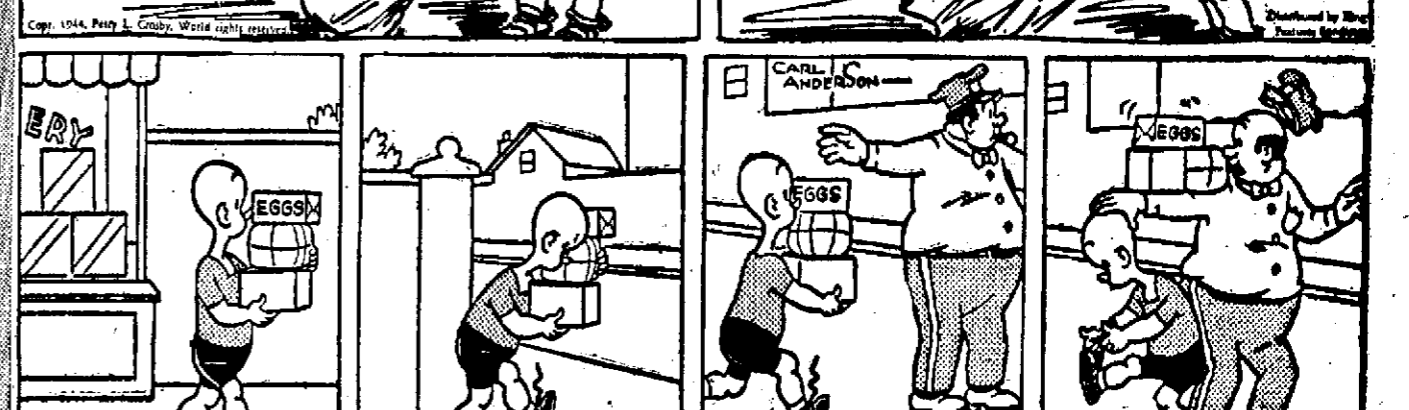
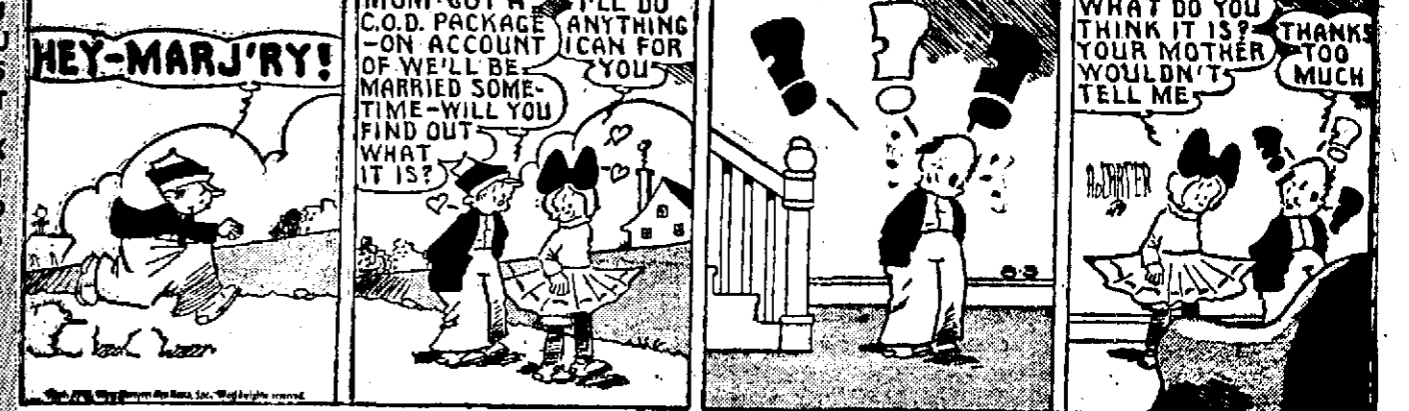
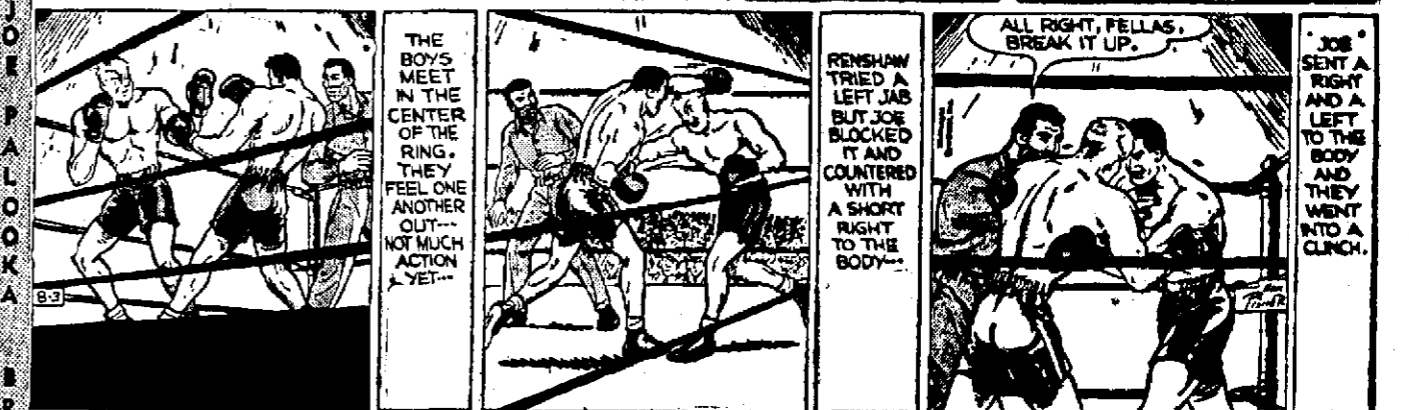

U. S. Corporation Control Urged

WASHINGTON — (UP) — The joint congressional economy committee, declaring that government corporations have grown so powerful that they rival government itself, has urged prompt action to make them subject to closer control by congress.
The recommendation was made in a report, based on nearly two years of study, in which the committee, headed by Sen. Harry F. Byrd, (D-Va.) revealed that government corporations had grown in number from 10 to 44 in the 13 years ending June 30, 1943.

Cody Earned Title of "Buffalo Bill" by Shooting Bison
When William Cody was 21 years old, he was given a new job. He was to supply fresh meat to 1,100 men who were working on the Kansas Pacific railway line.
Soon he started to earn \$500 per month by shooting enough buffaloes, or bison, to feed the workmen.
Each day Cody watched for a buffalo herd. With him he had only a single helper, a butcher who followed with a wagon to take the meat to camp.
One day Cody met a band of five American army officers. They also were buffalo hunting, and all were mounted. Not knowing the sharp-shooting scout, they told him he could join their party, and might possibly get in a "BUFFALO BILL"
whose statue stands in CENTRAL PARK, NEW YORK CITY.
