## NEGRO HOMELAND IS ADVOCATED BY SMITH

DETROIT, Aug. 8—(AP)—Gerald L. S. Smith, nominated for president by the Michigan convention of his America First party, said today he would advocate establishment of a "homeland in Africa for the American Negro."

Smith, in a statement to the press, said "we should compel the French and British to turn over to us for this purpose 1,000,000 square miles of Africa—to apply on their war debt to us."

The land, he said, would be made available to the American Negro "absolutely free." He proposed that this government give \$5,000 and free transportation to every Negro willing to migrate. He said this was a means to solve the Negro problem honestly and realistically.

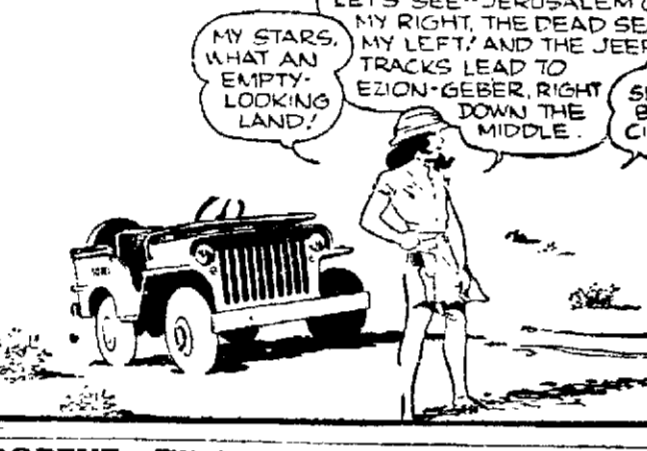

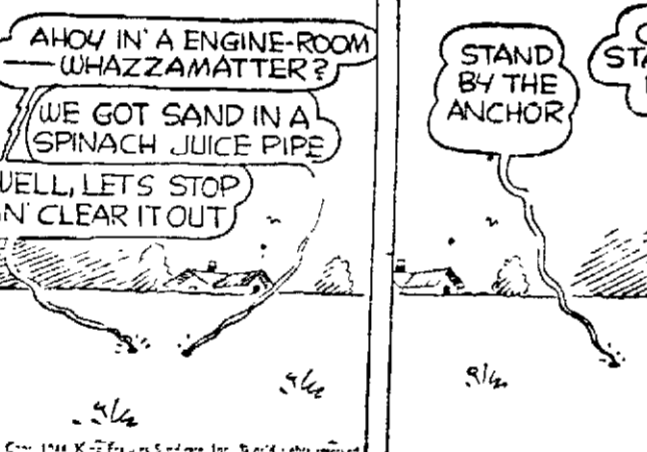

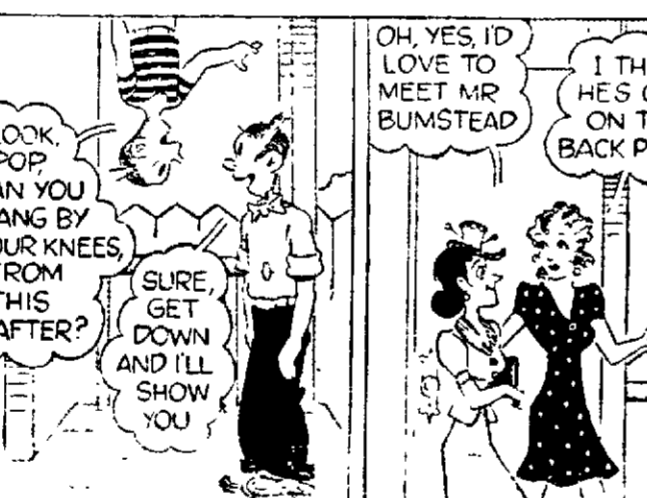

## MONTHLY BASIS ESTABLISHED ON PAPER QUOTAS

WASHINGTON, Aug. 8—(AP)—Newspaper publishers were directed today to compute their paper delivery quotas for the rest of the year on an average monthly basis.

This ruling by the printing and publishing division of the War Production Board means that any publisher may order from mills, in each of the last five months of 1944, one-fifth of his total consumption quota for those five months.

An amendment to the newspaper limitation order putting this procedure into effect will become effective Aug. 10, WPA said.

Each newspaper publisher will determine his monthly delivery quota base by adding his newspaper to the quota allotted him for the full fourth quota, including any extra tonnage granted upon appeal for use in those periods. The publisher then will divide this amount by five.

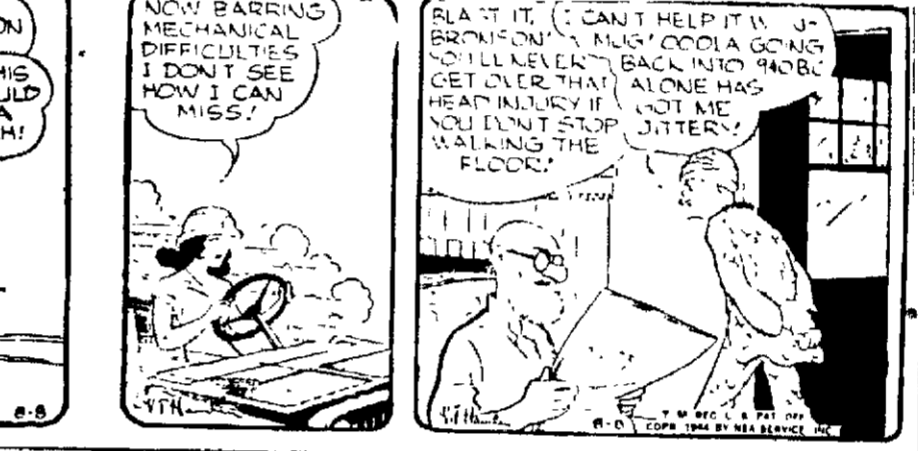

## PAYMENT OF FEES TO COURT ORDERED

COLUMBUS, Aug. 8—(UP)—Attorney General Thomas J. Herbert ruled today that fees for hearings of mental incompetents and juvenile delinquents must be paid to the probate court by the county treasurer despite a conflicting section of the general code which says that county officers shall receive no fees once they have been paid into the treasury.

"It is my opinion," Herbert said, "that the fees enumerated to the probate court from the county treasury are mandatory and such fees must be received by the probate court notwithstanding the provisions" of the second section.

The ruling was requested by Prosecuting Attorney James W. Dauby of MacArthur, O.
