FORMER GUARD GIVEN AUDIENCE BY POPE PIUS

VATICAN CITY, Aug. 21—(AP)—Pope Pius XII recently accorded a special audience to an American officer who used to be one of his own soldiers, it was learned today.

The pontiff received Lt. Carl Fehr, native of Lucerne Canton of Switzerland, who served in the Swiss Guards from 1933 to 1936 before migrating to the United States. He returned to Rome as an American officer and is now in the Allied Control Commission security section.

Fehr, whose home is at New Orleans, La., said he spent 45 minutes with the pope. The pontiff asked him jokingly if he wanted his old job back. Fehr declined, with thanks, saying he was "making out pretty well in the American army."

Fehr went to America in 1938, and became a citizen in 1942. In 1941 he married Miss Eileen Walsh of New Orleans, and the pope sent him a special blessing and a rosary for his bride.

OFFICER KILLED IN 42,000-FOOT CHUTE PLUNGE

DAYTON, O., Aug. 21—(AP)—Lt. Col. Melbourne W. Boynton, 89, chief of the medical safety division of the office of flying safety, was killed Saturday when his parachute failed to open in a 42,000-foot test jump at the Army air base near Wilmington, O.

He was attempting to develop procedure for air crews bailing out at high altitudes, officers at Wright Field reported.

More than 100 persons saw Boynton fall in a corn field near the air base.
