**Uncle Ray's Corner**  
 Publishers at First Failed to Accept Jane Austen's Books  
 Jane Austen felt sorry because she could not get her first book published, but she did not give up hope. Soon she wrote another

**"HIGH WAISTS"** were the FASHION during the EARLY PART of the 19th CENTURY, about the time when JANE AUSTEN wrote "PRIDE AND PREJUDICE".  
 novel, "Sense and Sensibility," but once more she failed to find a publisher.  
 Many a person would have stopped writing at that point, but there was an urge in Miss Austen to make her go ahead. Much of her time she spent helping her sister take care of the person's household, but she found moments in which she could write. While sewing or preparing meals, she would have an idea and would go to a table and write down a paragraph or two for her next novel.  
 In 1798, shortly before her twenty-third birthday, Jane finished a new novel, "Northanger Abbey." The manuscript was sold to a London firm called Crossbie and Co. for a sum equal to about \$50.  
 Happy was the young author for a time, but the volume was not published. The company locked the manuscript away in a safe, and kept it there for years!  
 Thus three great English novels "went begging" for a publisher. Years passed, and the Reverend Austen died. Keeping house together were the mother and her two daughters. Now and then they received letters from the sons in the family, but these sons were making their living elsewhere, two of them being in the British navy.  
 In 1811 the novel "Sense and Sensibility" went again to a publisher, and this time it appeared in print. Two years later, "Pride and Prejudice" was published. This was Jane's first novel, but she had changed it somewhat. It is the most famous, though perhaps not the best, of all she wrote.  
 Soon afterward, "Emma" and "Mansfield Park" were published. In not a single one of her novels did the name of Jane Austen appear as the author, while she was death. The humor in her books alive. The books were read by many persons, but only Jane's friends and relatives knew that she had written them.  
 Jane Austen died before her forty-second birthday. Two of her novels, including "Northanger Abbey," were published after her
