

Adria has a population of 16,000, It has not been moved, but the Po river has put land between it and the sea. Mud and silt are carried. to the Adriatic by the Po, and are dumped at the mouth. In this way it builds up a delta, just as does the Mississippi or the Nile. Only a few yards, or rods, may be added to the length of the delta each year, but in a century there is

quite a difference. Only two important rivers flow into the Adriatic, and these two are close together in northern Italy. One of these is the Po, the other is the Adige.

The Adriatic sea is about the same size as Lake Superior and Lake Huron together. On its shores the largest and most famous city is Venice. Venice had a population of 629,000 when the last census was taken.
