





















It is almost five feet high, and is hollow. Across one end is an animal hide, which is held in place, by wooden pegs. In Africa there are native tribes who use log drums to this day,

An African tom-tom is a piece of log which is partly hollow inside and has a slit in the wood at one end. It may be as little as two feet long and six inches thick, but there are large, powerful African tom-toms 10 feet long and three feet thick! African natives send messages

by beating their tom-toms and other kinds of drums. Striking a drum with a heavy stick, a native sends such a message as this, "White men are crossing the river." Miles away, this message is picked up and "talking drums" are beaten in other villages.

Hunters take small drums with which run from the stirrups of them at times, and employ them his saddle to the bridle. to send messages back to their village. A hunter may send such a simple message as this to his wife, "Am coming home! Have dinner ready for me!"

The modern kettledrum has more music in it than other kinds in playing it.
