Reid (1840-1908), a Scotchman, signed a railroad contract with the government of Newfoundland. This contract provided for the construction in three years of a transinsular railway from St. Johns to Port au Basque, to be paid for by a grant of land amounting to 5,000 acres for each mile constructed, in addition to other valuable considerations. In 1898 this contract was amended in a manner as to place Sir Robert in possession of an aggregate of 5,000,000 acres of land, as well as most of the mines, ores, minerals, railroads, steamships, docks, telegraph lines and timber of the country.
