#### Elvehiem Raps Deceiving Radio Ads

Radio advertising which leads to exploded hopes has done more to estroy faith in nutrition research than any other single cause, Prof. Conrad A. Elvehjem, of the University of Wisconsin biochemistry department, asserted Monday at a public session of the 20th Harris Foundation institute now being held at the University of Chicago.

"In many areas, the present generation has seen the complete disappearance of rickets, beri-beri, and pellagra as a result of proper application of scientific knowledge," he said. "People familiar with these results expect their arthritis, colds, and other illnesses to be treated with the same rapidity. Since this is not possible, they begin to grumble a little about nutritional research."

The pernicious type of commercial advertising, and ments and articles by pseudo-nu-tritionists build up hopes, un-founded on scientific fact, which, when exploded, leads to a loss of interest in nutrition, he said. There are indications that the interest has already waned considerably.







