CLINTON-CO TO RESUME DRAFT

COLUMBUS, O., Sept. 7—(AP)—State selective service headquarters announced today that the newly-organized Clinton-co draft board at Wilmington would issue its first call late this month. The reorganized three-member board replaces the five-man body which resigned several months ago during a dispute with state headquarters over certain deferment policies. No calls have been issued in the county, which has only one board, since the resignation. Manpower officers did not indicate the size of the initial call but it was pointed out that calls have been reduced greatly in recent months and probably would reflect successes on military fronts.

DRIVER LOSES VETERAN NEWS ARM; CHASES EDITOR IS DEAD HIT-SKIP TRUCK

WEST LOS ANGELES, Calif., Sept. 6—(INS)—Joseph A. Mulcahy, 63, former managing editor of The New York Journal, The Detroit Times and The San Francisco Call-Bulletin, died last night at the home of his son, J. T. Mulcahy. Death was due to a heart attack. He came to California for his health about four months ago, after resigning a post with the Hearst Sunday papers in New York.

Mulcahy was born in New York City and began his newspaper career there as a reporter on the old
