

Story Of Sgt. Bennett Presented On Cavalcade

A story of rehabilitation work performed by the Army Air Forces, as seen thru the eyes of an injured waist gunner, is the subject for "Cavalcade of America" Monday (WEAF, 7 p. m., EST).

Titled "The Doctor Gets an Answer," this is the tale of Sgt. Doug Bennett, waist gunner of a Flying Fortress that was shot down over Germany shortly before D-Day. It tells of Bennett's chute jump with his pal, who is shot from the air by an attacking Nazi plane. It relates Bennett's escape to France, where he is picked up by the British invasion forces and shipped back to England.

Story Of Lost Convoy Is Told

WASHINGTON, Sept. 11—(AP)—The story of a "forgotten convoy" which spent eight months in Arctic North Russia—so long, in fact, that the American sailors learned to talk to Russian girls without the aid of an interpreter—was told today by the War Shipping Administration.

In January of last year, six U. S. ships, loaded with food and war materials, sailed from New York to join 18 other Allied freighters, bound for Murmansk.

After weathering storms and Nazi air attacks off Norway, the convoy made its destination, in two months, and the crews settled down to await the formation of a new convoy for the return trip. It was eight months later before their ships were put into a return convoy.

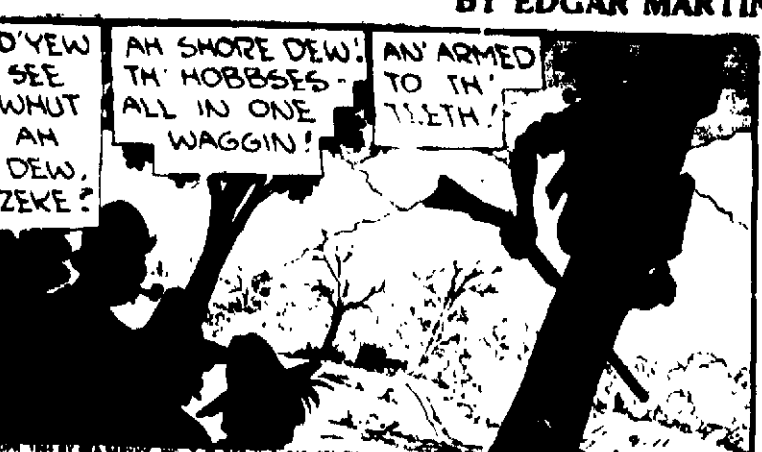
As time dragged on, the seamen found an interpreter willing to arrange dates with Russian girls and to carry on the "he said" and "she said." But before the new convoy finally was made up the interpreter long since had lost his job. He just wasn't needed any more.

An American naval attaché in North Russia filled out official-looking certificates of membership in the "Society of the Forgotten Convoy of North Russia."

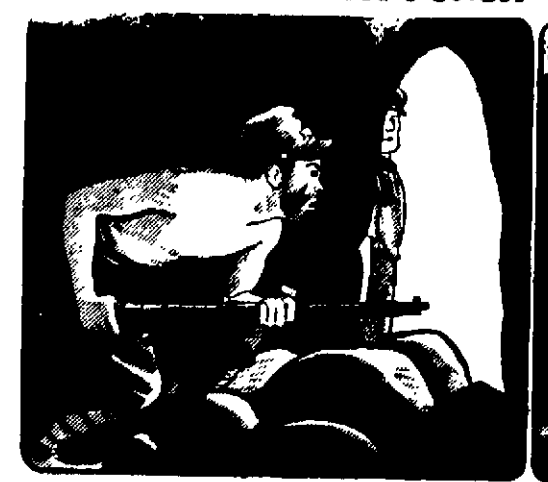

SAIPAN OUSTER ACT CONFIRMED BY GEN. SMITH

WASHINGTON, Sept. 11—(INS)—Lt. Gen. Holland M. Smith, commanding general of fleet Marine forces in the Pacific, admitted today that "circumstances" forced him to relieve Maj. Gen. Ralph C. Smith of a lesser Army command at the height of the American conquest of Saipan, but neither he nor the War department would admit what the circumstances were.

The "battle of the Generals Smith," as Washington military observers have labeled the Saipan affair, was merely a subject of rumor until today when Gen. Holland Smith disclosed his action to a news conference, at which he also predicted continued punishment of the Japanese by the Marines.

The War department immediately confirmed his disclosure of Gen. Ralph Smith's removal from command at the battle of Saipan, but "passed the buck" back to the Marine corps for further explanation as the "conqueror of Saipan" first admitted doing to the Army.

REDS RENEW PLEA FOR FRANCO OUSTER

NEW YORK, Sept. 11—(AP)—The Moscow radio today renewed its appeal to the Spanish people to oust the regime of Generalissimo Francisco Franco, the Federal Communications Commission reported.

Saying that the "foreign press" continued to comment on intentions of widely-known fascists to seek a haven "in the affectionate arms of Franco," the broadcast said the Nazis, "dreaming of their colony on the Mediterranean shores," already were packing to join the 300,000 Germans it said

FRENCH CABINET IS BEING RESHUFFLED

NEW YORK, Sept. 11—(INS)—Gen. Charles de Gaulle, head of the Provisional French government, reshuffled his cabinet to night, replacing Rene Massigli as foreign minister with Georges Bidault and naming Adrien Tixier, former Free French delegate in the U. S., as minister of the interior, the U. S. radio announced.

De Gaulle named a number of new ministers and reassigned others, said the broadcast reported by the FCC. Finance Minister Pierre Mendefrance was shifted to the ministry of national economy, and Fernand Grenier was dropped as air minister.
