

BETHLEHEM, Pa., Sept. 16 -Bethlehem Steel Co. reported today that steel forgings totaling 951,000 tons were turned ouf from Jan 1, 1941, to Jan. 1, 1911, with production increases langing as high as 119 per cent for 1913 over 1942. The company said that in 1943

steel forgings shipped totaled 411,000 tons, an increase of 25,5 per cent over the 1942 total. The figures were approved by the

Gun forgings shipped last year totaled 21,200 tons, an increase of 119 per cent over 1942, the company reported. Armor shipments in 1943 were 40,000 net tons, a 31 per cent increase over the previous year. The company boosted its production of airplane engine cylinders 83 per cent last year, turning out 2,500,000 forgmes, and furnishing 55 to 60 per cent of the country's requirements in 1943.

The 1943 output of 75 and 96 mm projectiles reached 1,000,000 pieces while ship and ship machanges torgings totaled 150,350 tons, a use of 74 per cent over 1942. The company shipped 732,-000 rough projectile forgings in 1943, an 81 per cent increase over The company perfected a new

technique for production of heattreated gun barrel forgings for 30 and 50 calibre guns in 1942 and the following year shipped 2,115,000 such forgings, it said. Other shipments reported for the 1941-41 period include: heat treated and machined armor plate. 65,000 tons; torpedo sir flasks, 18,200; three to 16-inch projectiles, 2,735,000; small gun bartels, 2,582,000; amplane engine cylinders, 4,546,000; railroad and mme cars fabricated, 18,800; wire tope, 100,000 tons; heat-treated and machined gun forgings,
