are mostly gray above and white beneath. There are streaks of white in the wings, and the tail is black with a white edge. The male has red feathers on his head and he shows the red patch plainly when he raises his crest during the mating season. Kingbirds nest in southern Can-

ada, from coast to coast, and in most parts of the United States. During the present month they are on their way to points far to the south. Some of them will spend the winter in Mexico, but most will go to Central America or South America. Peru and Colombia have kingbirds in January and February.
Birds which make long migra-

tions do their singing chiefly out to attack enemies which weigh where they build their nests. This from 20 to 50 times as much as is true of the kingbirds.


