War Department Reveals Names Of Casualties

A Van Wert man was listed missing and six other Lima district soldiers reported wounded in action in a roster of war casualties released Friday by the War department.

Reported missing is S. Sgt. Earl E. Yoh, 1, aerial gunner, son of Mr. and Mrs. Joshua Yoh, Sr., of Scott, 10 miles north of Van Wert.

Wounded are: Pvt. Donald H. Mohrman, son of Mrs. Marie Mohrman, New Bremen, Pfc. Lester P. Leatherman, son of Mrs. Salome Leatherman, Ft. Jennings, Route 2, Pfc. Kenneth A. Bowers, son of William N. Bowers, Dupont, Pfc. Eugene Ries, son of Mrs. Callie Ries, Kenton, Route 1; Pvt. Franklin C. Dugan, son of Mrs. Anna L. Dugan, Celina, and Pvt. Harold A. Hirsch, son of Mr. and Mrs. H. A. Hirsch, Harrod, Route 1.

Sgt. Yoh is reported missing since Sept. 1 over the Palau Islands. The airman enlisted in Aug. 1943, received his basic training at Amarillo, Tex., and was graduated from Flexible Flying and Gunnery school at Laredo, Tex. His sister, Clara Yoh, lives in Lima.

Sgt. Thomas, according to the ar department has been missing since Sept. 5, when he failed to return after a Flying Fortress bombing mission over Germany. He had been overseas since May.

B-3, C-3 GAS TICKETS TO BE INVALID SOON

WASHINGTON, Sept. 21—(AP)—Supplementary gasoline coupons "B-3" and "C-3" will be invalid for use by motorists after Sept. 30, of Office of Price Administration announced today.

Commercial vehicle "T" coupons marked "3rd Qtr." will expire at the same time.

"B" and "C" coupons numbered four and five will continue to be valid.

Motorists holding "B-3" and "C-3" coupons issued for use beyond Sept. 30 may exchange them for valid stamps at local ration boards, OPA said.

YANK CASUALTIES NOW EXCEED 400,000

WASHINGTON, Sept. 22 — (AP) — War casualties of the United States armed forces now exceed 400,000.

Secretary of War Stimson said today Army casualties reported thru Aug. 29 were 337,743. The latest Navy casualty list totals 63,017.

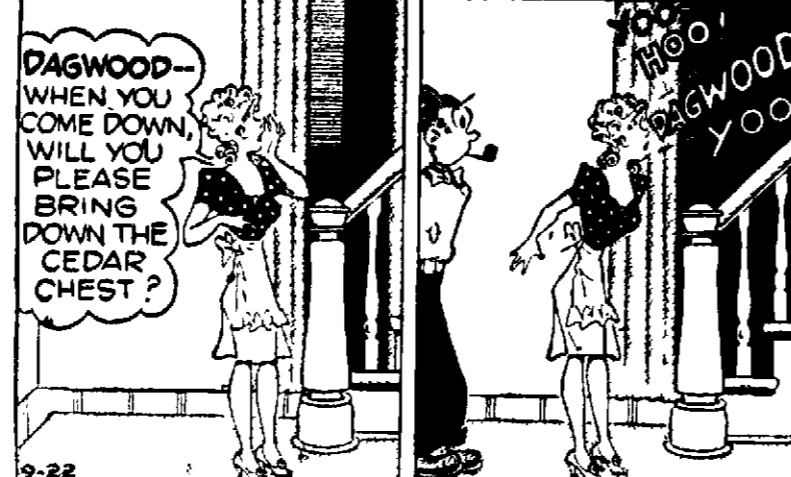
The new army figure was an increase of 10,127 over that announced a week ago, but only about half the rate of increase in recent weeks.

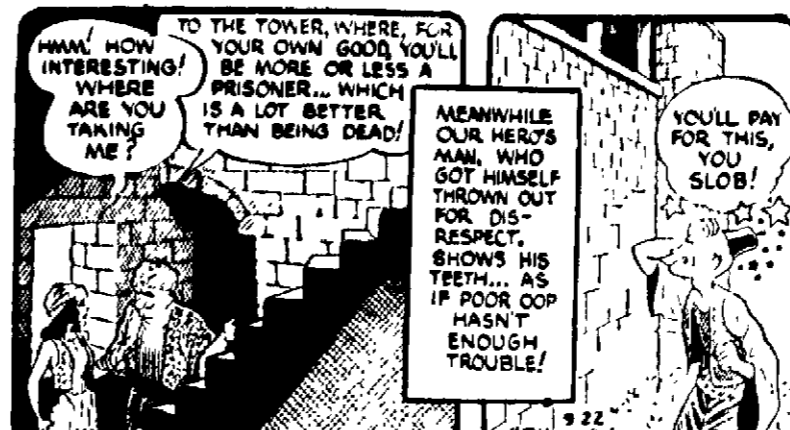

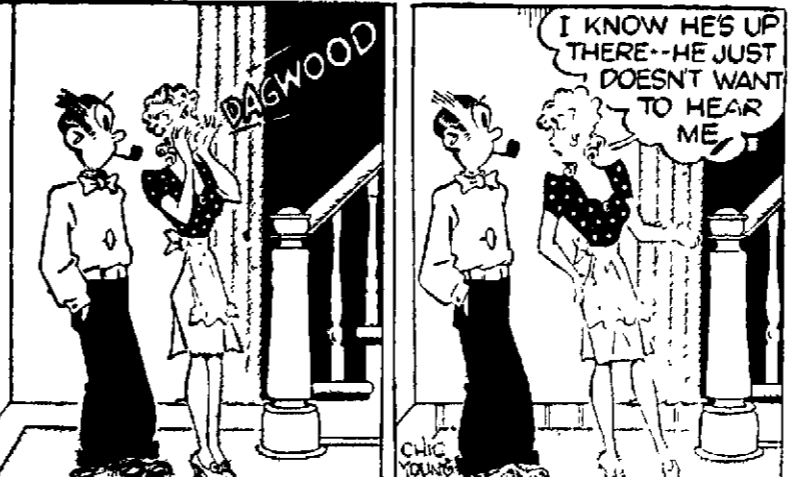

Dying Miner Hopes Sons Can Work In Sunshine

BELLAIRE, O., Sept. 22—(AP)—A dying man, trapped with 65 others deep in Powhatan mine, wrote in his last hours a letter hoping his sons never would work in the pits but instead stay "out-side where there is sunshine."

The letter, made public today, was left by Ralph Vilkoski of Shadyside, a foreman who perished with his companions last July 5.

Only yesterday state mine officials released a long chronology of death written by George Emery, who in the last hours of life told how gas and smoke felled men all around him.

Vilkoski's letter said: "Dearest wife and Norman and Eric, we are O. K. so far. It is 9:15 p. m. We have barricaded ourselves at 7 right. C-north and have confidence in the other fellows working to rescue us.

"Please work hard and take care of the boys. If Norman's leg isn't better in a few days take him to a good doctor and get X-rays taken of his leg. Have them grow up and be strong boys and healthy. Have them go thru school and get a good education so they won't have to make a living in the mine. Give them all they deserve.

"You take it on the chin like a brave mother. Do whatever you want with the furniture. Take it to mother's and stay there with her, she is a swell mother or go to your mother's and stay.

"Tell my mother to take it on the chin, also ask dad to take care of the money and give them the best in the world. Have them
