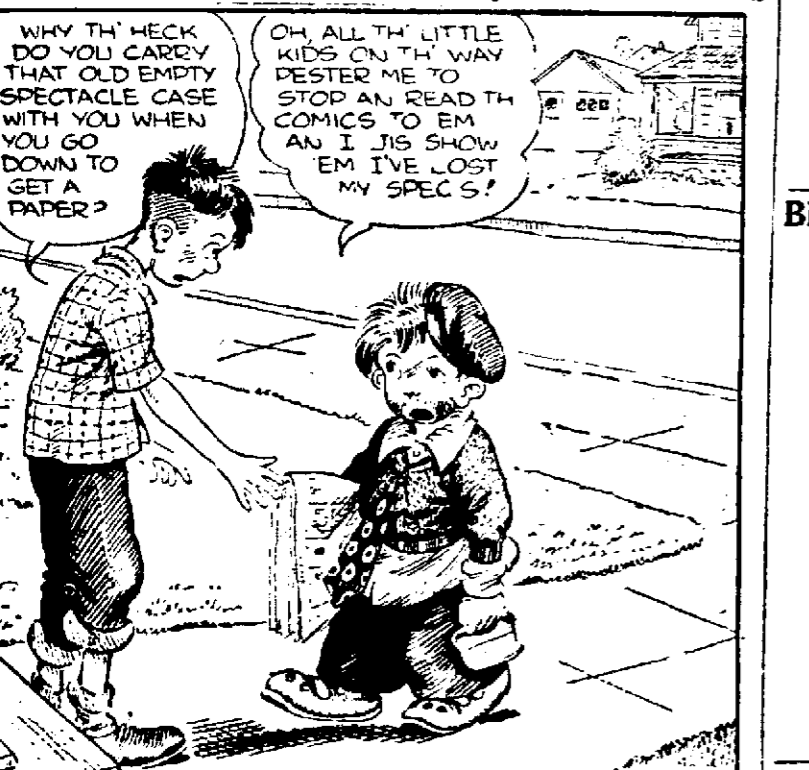

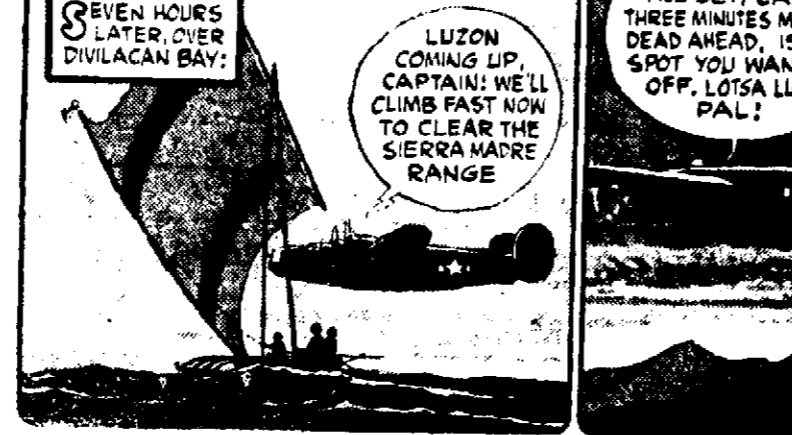

COLUMBUS, O., Sept. 26 (INS)—Fourteen campaign addresses by the two candidates for governor are on tap in Ohio this week, with Mayor James Garfield Stewart of Cleveland, Republican, delivering most of the speeches. Cleveland Mayor Frank J. Lausche speaks five times in three days, but has the rest of the week free. Stewart was scheduled at a party at Piqua Monday; will talk at Louisville and Millersburg on Tuesday, and will be at Mansfield Wednesday evening. Thursday will find Stewart at the Knowlton fair in Mt. Vernon in the afternoon and at a Springfield fair in Hamilton, before attending a Lima rally, and Saturday he will make a one-day tour of Williams-co with an address at Edgerton.

Lausche will attend a dinner at Edgerton Wednesday; a Miami University meeting at Oxford and the Butler-co fair at Hamilton Thursday, and Friday will speak at Cornwaller in the morning before attending the Hardin-co fair at Kenon in the afternoon.
