SHERWOOD QUILTS OWI POST TO AID ROOSEVELT

Washington, Sept. 27 — (INS) — Playwright Robert E. Sherwood, credited with being one of President Roosevelt's best "ghost writers," was firmly established today as a leader of the fourth-term campaign.

Sherwood, in a letter to Elmer Davis, chief of the Office of War Information, resigned as director of the OWI's overseas branch to devote himself to politics.

The playwright long has collaborated with Roosevelt in writing speeches and is credited with having written a major portion of the President's Saturday night address.

Sherwood said it was his conviction that Roosevelt's reelection "and the peoples' endorsement of plianter to replace gypsum."
