### MORE EFFICIENT KITCHENS IN STORE FOR HOUSEWIVES

**NEW YORK, Sept. 30—(UP)—**Some of the changes in store for the post-war world were outlined recently by J. Gordon Lippincott, noted industrial designer.

Tomorrow's kitchen will incorporate many time-saving devices, eliminating hundreds of miles from the average 3,000 miles a year covered by women in today's kitchen, he says. The uppermost shelves will slide down within easy reach of the shortest woman, corner sinks will utilize space heretofore lost, the refrigerator and stove will be easily accessible.

Electric irons will be almost a necessity because of the swing to synthetic fabrics. Washing machines will be sold in tandem, with dryers to provide for drying one batch of clothes while another is being washed, motifs will be eliminated and bacteria in foods will be killed by use of ultra-violet and infra-red rays.

Among objects which in the past have served as money are metals, furs, sheep, skins, cattle, skulls, grates, tobacco, olive oil and salt.

### NEW PRESIDENT OF SANTA FE IS DIESEL PIONEER

**CHICAGO, Sept. 30—(INS)—**Fred G. Gurley, new president of the Santa Fe system, has many "young ideas" for the future of railroading.

The new plans are natural for the rail executive, who at 35 is one of the youngest presidents of any major system in the country. A pioneer in the development of the modern Diesel engine, Gurley said:

"In the present stages of development of the steam and Diesel engine, one is warranted in making plans to use more Diesels. However, we cannot foresee that in two or three years from now new development in the use of steam may be perfected.

"With the Diesel, secondary routes which are not now stops on the crack train schedules will get better service. If we build smaller trains, we can give just as comfortable rides on the short runs as we now do on the longer trips.

"This revolves around passenger travel. If we hadn't been so smart in the 15 years after 1920, we could have held this passenger traffic."

Gurley said he believed "some of the railroads" would go into a coordinated set-up with the airlines. He added:

"And I hope laws are not passed which will close the doors to railroad participation in air operations."

Gurley said the Santa Fe board of directors have under contemplation a "remodernization" program for the Dearborn-station, which will involve a \$500,000 expenditure.

**ENGLAND HAS MORE BABIES, LESS WEDDINGS**

LONDON, Sept. 30—(UP)—The stock continued to work overtime in England and Wales during the first three months of this year, a tabulation of the Registrar-General's records shows.

In the first quarter of 1944 there were 14,145 babies born, a figure which represents a birth-rate of 17.9 per 1,000 population, the highest quarter rate since 1926.

But Cupid's arrows apparently went wide of their mark in the same period. The number of marriages was the second lowest for any quarter since the war, the rate is still slightly higher than that of prewar years.

Up to March 31 this year 62,699 couples were married. This number exceeds by only 262 the figure for the first quarter last year, which was the lowest of the war. It is 8,338 more, however, than the first-quarterly average for the five years before the war.

Of the babies, 94,964 were boys and 89,181 were girls, giving a ratio of 1,065 boys to every 1,000 girls. The average for the 10 preceding first quarters was 1,000.

The provisional infant mortality rate of 58 per 1,000 related live births was 14 below the average of the 10 preceding first quarters and was the lowest rate on record for this period of the winter.
