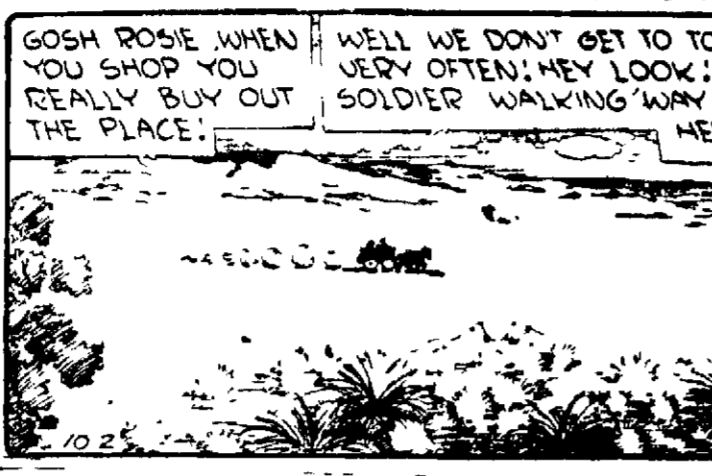
TRUCK DRIVER KILLED

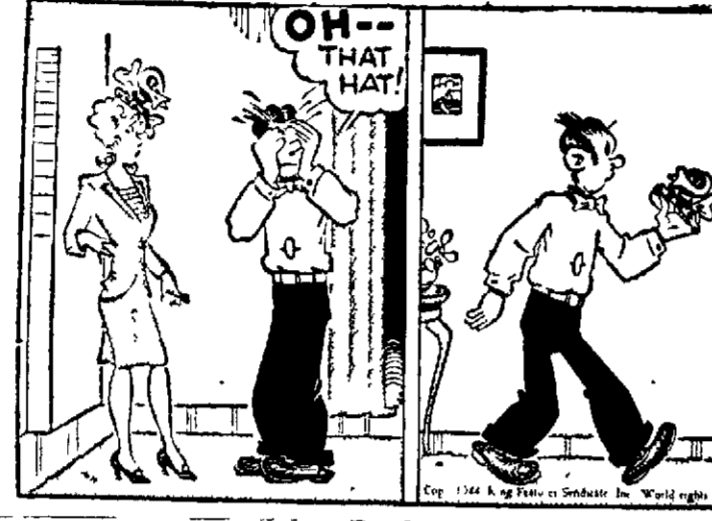

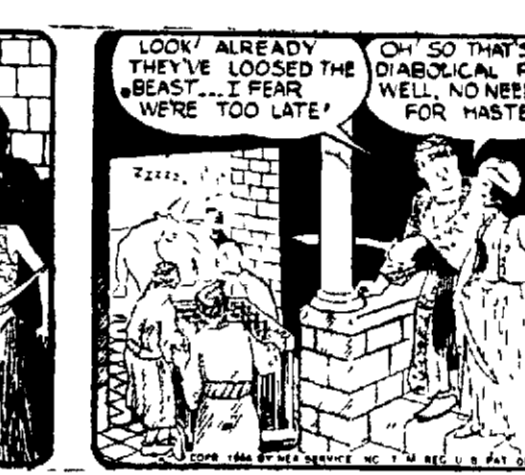

Hit by the long summer drought, the sweet potato crop didn't turn out so well with Boyer but he does admit that those he grew were "nice." There was only one in the hill that produced the prize, giant and appears to be made up of six good-sized spuds.

Usually, Boyer points out, when the growing season is favorable, three or four nice potatoes come from each hill. But this year the picture has changed. If the potato is of any size, it's the only one in the hill, otherwise, there may be three or four small ones.

Boyer expects to use the huge vegetable for seed and estimated that it would produce some 500 plants, or more than 200 than he will need for next season's planting.

In case anyone would like to try their luck on growing giant sweet potatoes and would like some of the plants from this specimen, the line forms to the right, Boyer says, somewhere on Lima Route 6.

Tom Paine's Mighty Pen To Be Dramatized On Airwaves

If ever a pen was mightier than the sword, it was the pen of Tom Paine, whose life will be dramatized by the "Cavalcade of America" in a stirring play by Robert Tallman titled "The Voice On The Stairs" Monday, over WEAF at 7 p. m. (EST).

Edward G. Robinson will play the role of Tom Paine. In the early days of struggle in 1776, many weary souls turned aside from the fight. Gen. Washington and his loyal men were attacking hard but headed help. It then came from the fiery pen of Tom Paine, whose immortal words brought thousands of new swords and guns into the field.

Tom Paine wrote, "These are times that try men's souls. The summer soldier and the sunshine patriot will, in the crisis, shrink from service of their country; but he that stands it now, deserves the love and thanks of men and women. Tyranny, like hell, is not easily conquered, yet we have this consolation with us, that the harder the conflict, the more glorious the triumph."

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Bob Hawk will continue to say "Thanks to The Yanks" for at least another year, under terms of a 52-week renewal just handed the popular quiz. The renewal goes into effect with the broadcast Monday, at 6 30 p. m. "Home in Indiana," a poignant story of the horse-breeding district of Indiana, is the dramatic vehicle to be presented in the Radio theatre on Monday. Jeanne Crain and June Haver have been signed by producer Cecil B. DeMille to recreate their motion picture roles over station WABC at 8 p. m. (EST). The full-hour dramatic show celebrates its tenth anniversary this fall over the airwaves.
