# Co-Chairmen To Direct YM Aquatic Plan

Robert O. Doyal, 403 N. Collett-st, and Mrs. Kay Glaser, 1019 W. Wayne-st, have been named co-chairmen of a new committee which will head the aquatic program of the Y. M. C. A. for fall and winter. Richard Brandt, director of physical education at the Y, announced Saturday.

All phases of the program will be held strictly to national aquatic standards, Brandt stated. These will include overcoming fear, adjustment to the water, buoyancy and ability to float, water safety, learning to submerge, breath control, instruction in the various kicks, arm strokes, coordination of muscles and nerves.

In the boys' division members will take standard tests and will be classified according to individual ability. Achievement cards and emblems will be awarded to those of exceptional ability.

Water safety, life saving and functional swimming will have a large place in the winter's activities. The latter has been highly developed by the Y. M. C. A. in the last few years and is endorsed by the armed forces.

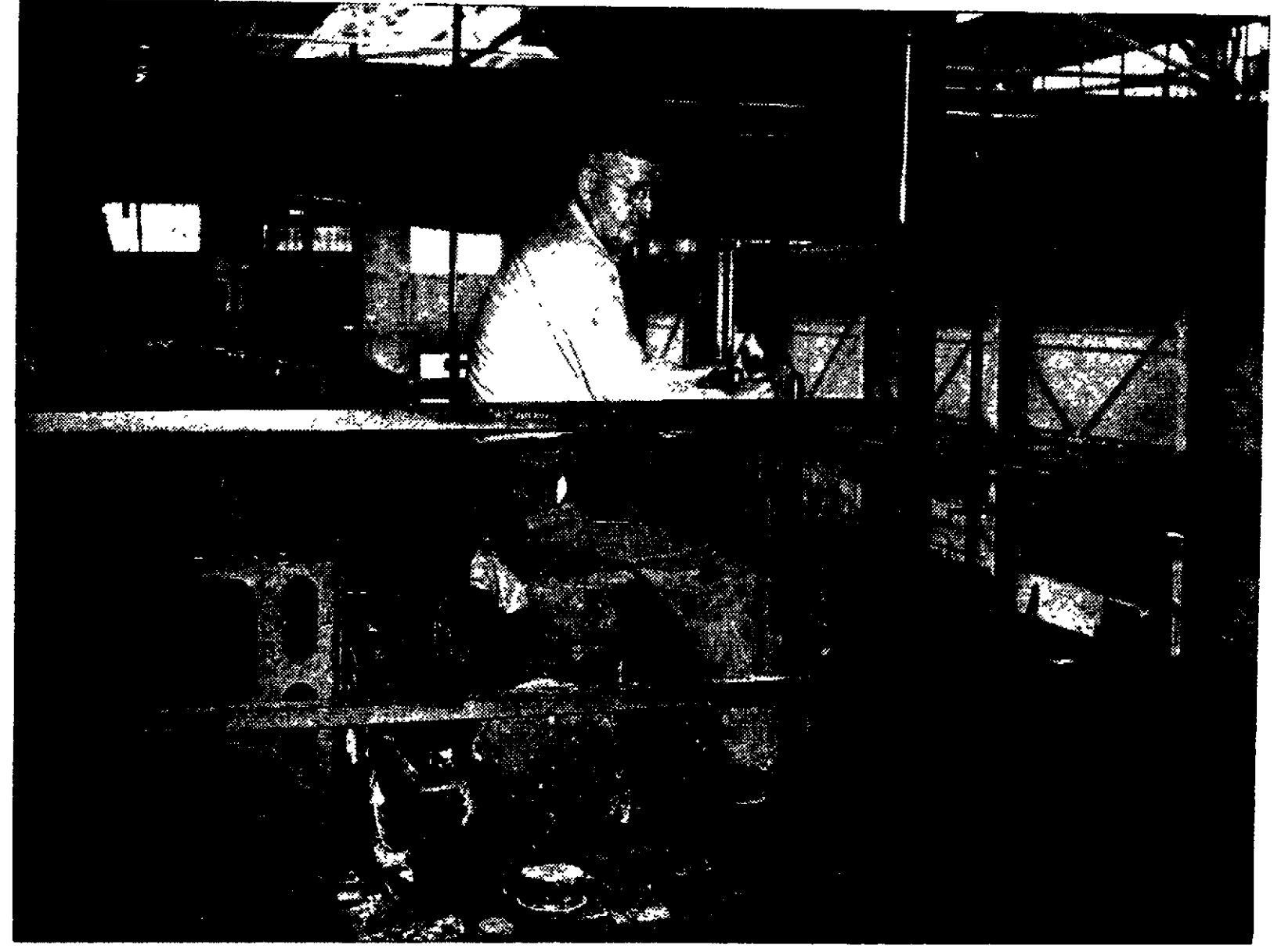
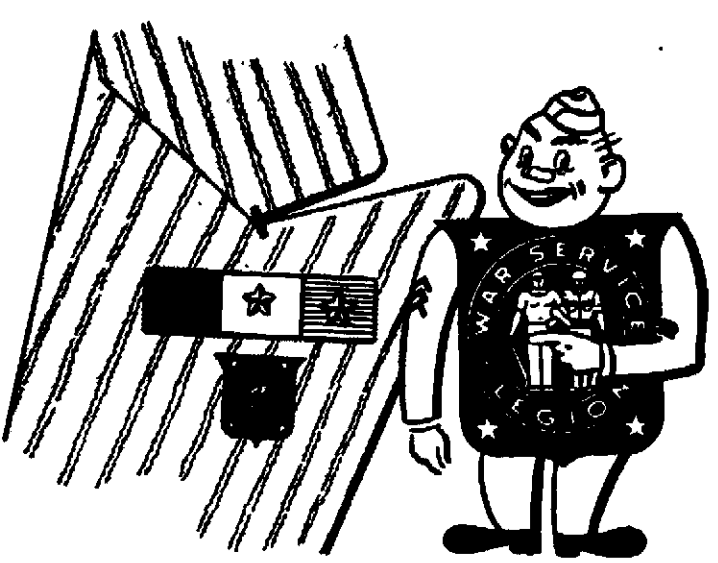
