

Historical Drama Is Recreated For Radio

Maxwell Anderson's great historical drama, "Valley Forge," is recreated for radio with Walter Huston portraying General Washington on the special 10th anniversary series of "Cavalcade of America," Monday, over WEAF at 7 p. m., Lima time.

"Valley Forge," produced a few seasons ago by the New York Theatre Guild, tells the story of General Washington's bitter winter at Valley Forge when the hunger, cold and deplorable equipment of his troops seemed to make defeat inevitable. The part depicted in this "Cavalcade" broadcast includes Washington's decision to meet with General Howe to discuss terms for possible surrender of the colonial troops.

Interesting questions to which contestants must provide answers, and a barrage of wit from Bob Hawk, the emcee, feature "Thanks to the Yanks" over WABC Monday at 6:30 p. m. Hospital receiving duffel bags filled with cigarettes during the program are the U. S. Naval hospital, Bainbridge, Md., and the U. S. Naval hospital Long Beach, Calif. Music is supplied by Lynn Gardner, singer, and Peter Van Steeden's orchestra.

Musical questions will have tough slodging on "Information Please" Monday over WEAF at 8:30 p. m. when Alec Templeton and Leonard Bernstein are guest experts.

Templeton pianist and composer returns for a second bout. John Kieran and Franklin P. Adams are the regular experts, with Clifton Fadiman as master of ceremonies.

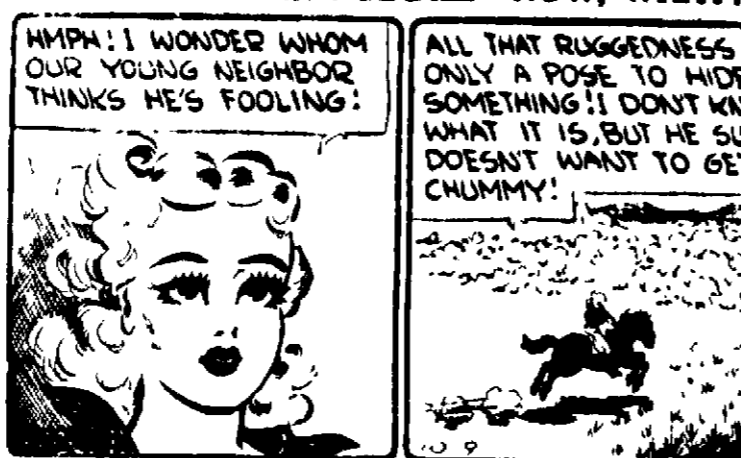
Finns expect long task in ousting Nazis. STOCKHOLM, Oct. 9—(AP)—Finnish general staff officers say the Finns must "fight a rather long war" in Lapland before they can eliminate an estimated 100,000 to 110,000 Germans who have moved supplies northward for a winter war.

President Gustaf von Mannerheim of Finland is understood to have compared the task facing the Finns to the 1941 offensive against the Russians, which cost an unofficially estimated 30,000 Finnish lives.

Reliable sources from Helsinki said the Russians have modified the armistice to permit the Finns to use their air force and have waived the armistice clause obliging the Finns to demobilize within two and one-half months. The Russians have not interfered with the Finnish campaign against the Germans, although they have observed attacks to the Finn's army.

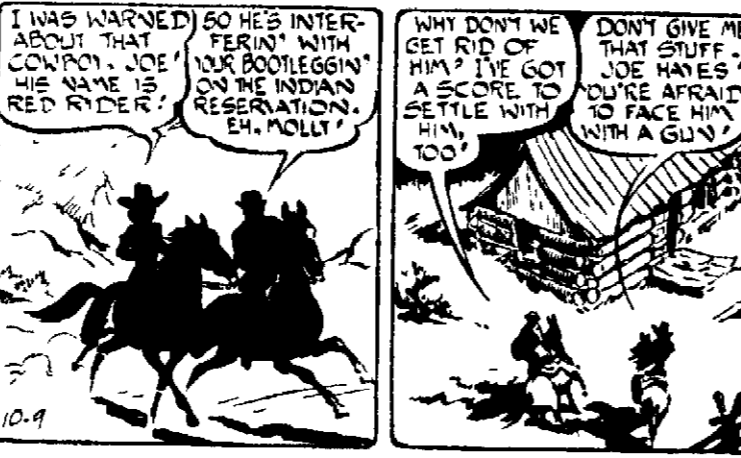

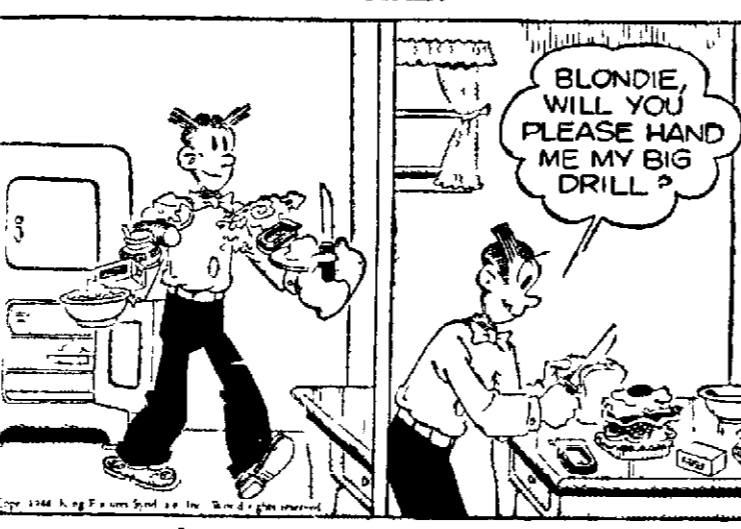

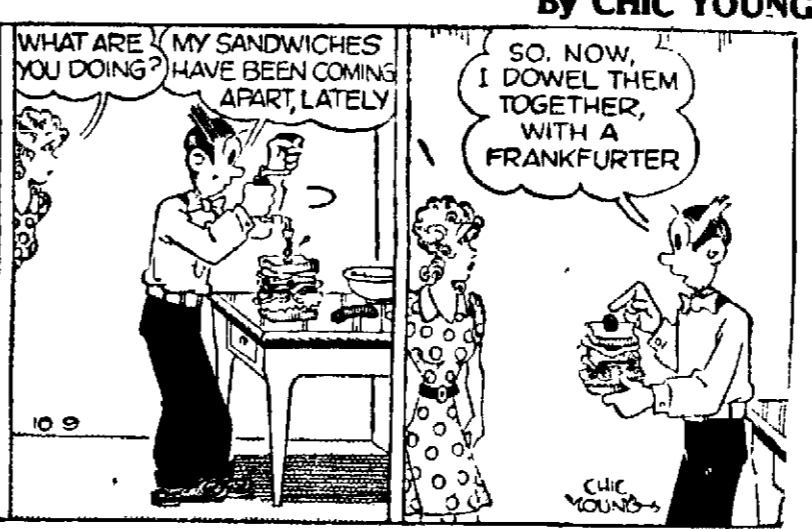
