Only 6 Truck Firms Returned to Owners

MINNEAPOLIS (U.P.) — Ellis T. Longnecker, Office of Defense Transportation (ODT) representative, who came here in August to direct operations of 103 over-the-road trucking firms seized by the government to halt a strike, said that only six companies have been returned to private operation and there is no prospect for immediate improvement in the situation.

Companies returning to private operation "made peace with the union and we felt no concern as to their being able to take care of themselves," Longnecker said, adding that the turnback was at their own request.

The ODT took over operation of the trucking companies after operators declined to comply with an order for a retroactive wage increase of approximately 7 cents an hour. Longnecker said he found that a large number of the firms actually were not in position to give the back pay.

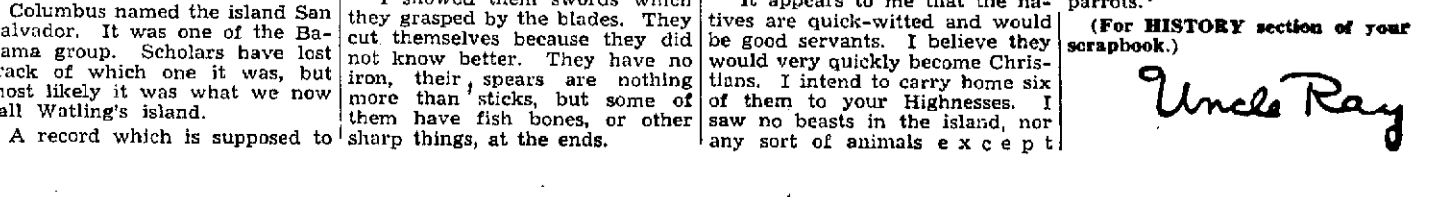
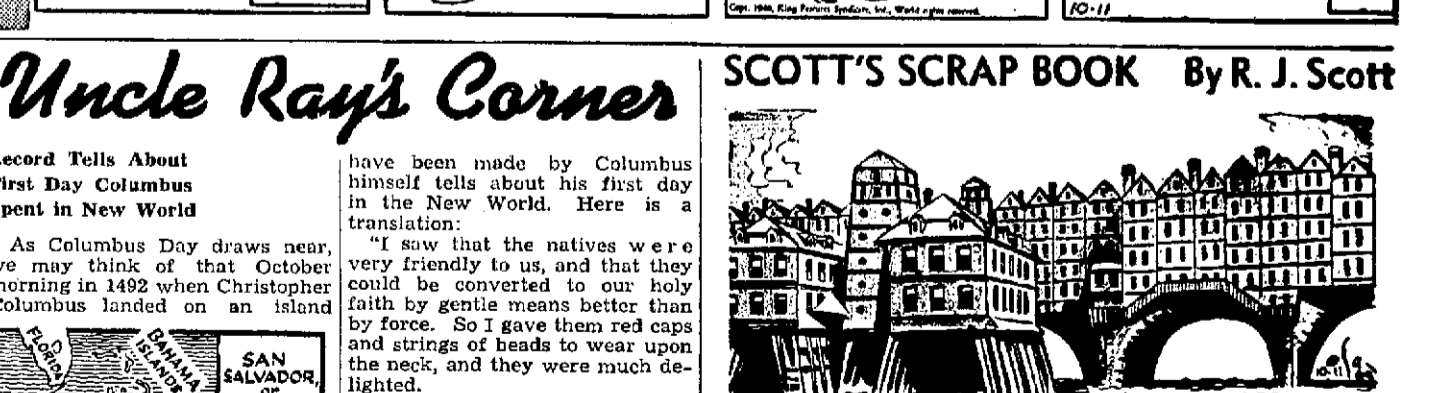
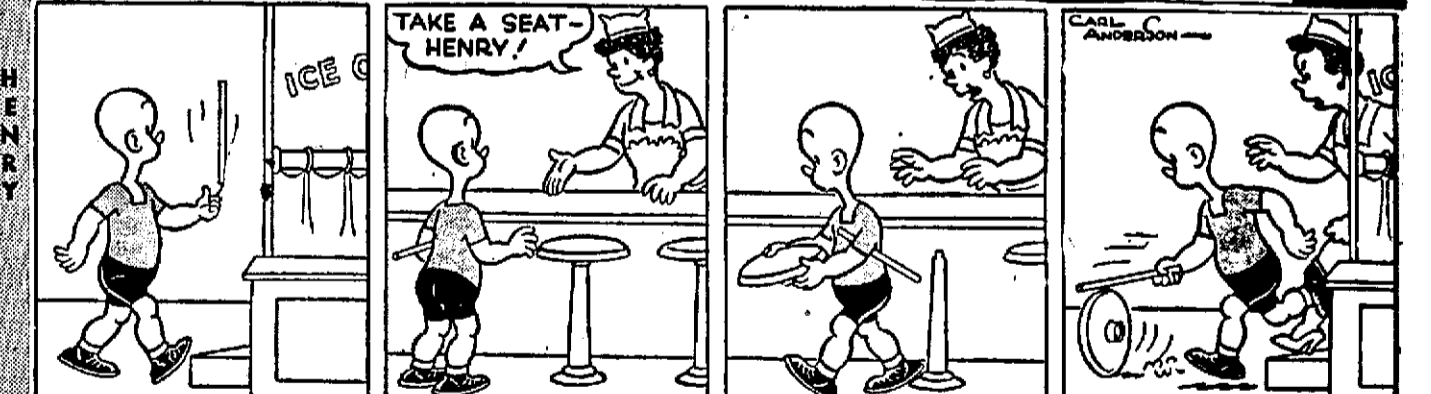
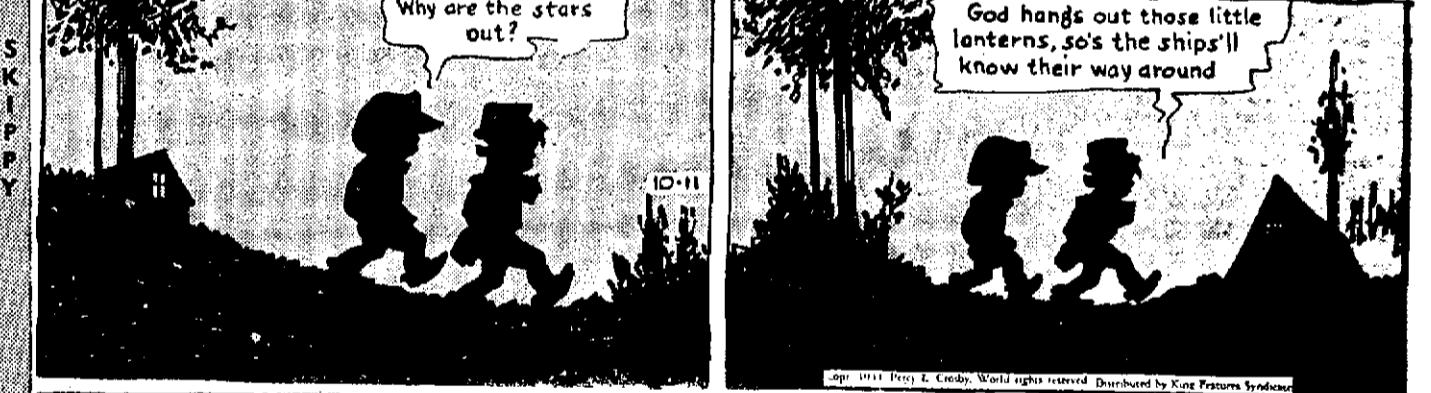
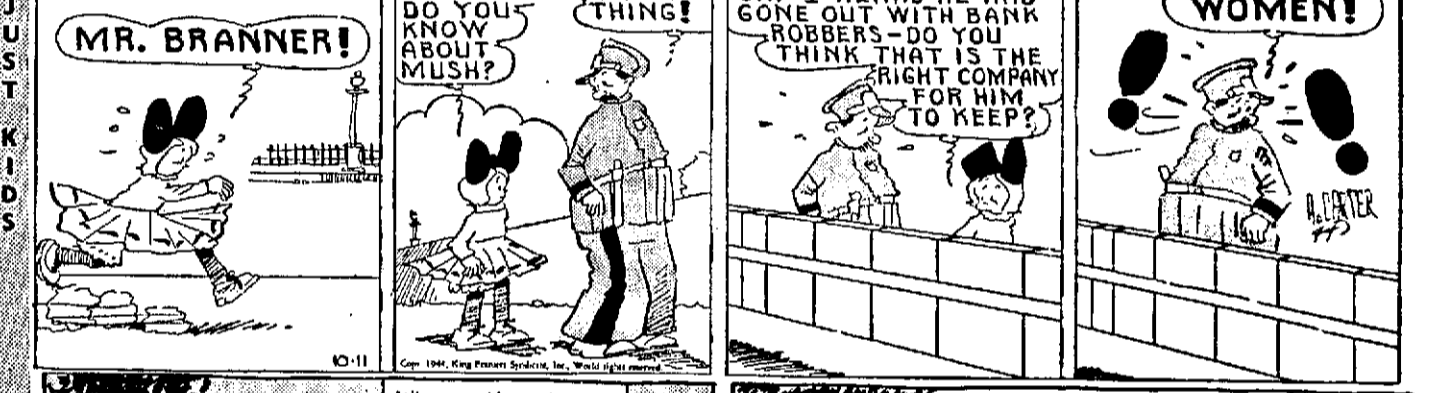
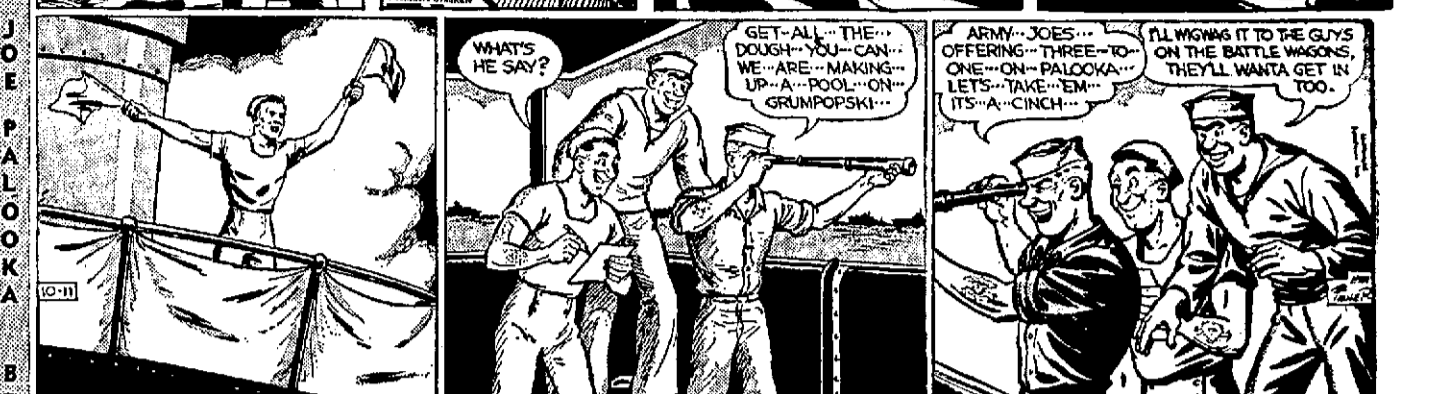
