Says Rationing Operated For Political Gain

SACRAMENTO, Calif., Oct. 14 (UP) Gov. John W. Bricker of Thio declared today that the Office of Price Administration was inept, confused and devoid of planning and was being operated for political advantage.

But he asserted that handling of rationing by the OPA had been incompetent in eight ways:

1-Planning was obviously poor, 2-OPA had no understanding of the "psychology of rationing," actually encouraging hoarding. 3-1rregular rationing periods created confusion.

4-Rationing was not coordinated with pricing. 5-OPA had not always known how many rationing coupons it had

6-Responsibility was divided. 7-Unnecessary complex systems and forms were adopted. 8- Black markets flourished and the pleasure driving ban was

Bricker illustrated the "political implications" remark by citing he recent order of OPA making missed as "astonishing" rumors of the removal.
