

Constitutional Amendment Proposal To Be Broadcast

Pro and cons of a proposed amendment to the constitution of the United States will be discussed by four prominent speakers on "America's Town Meeting of the Air," when the broadcast from Providence, R. I., is devoted to the question, "Should Treaties Be Ratified by a Majority of Both Houses?" The broadcast will be heard over Station WJZ at 7:30 p. m., Lima time.

Arguing for preservation of the constitutional method, which provides for ratification of treaties by a two-thirds vote of the senate, will be Sen. Raymond E. Willis (R-Ind), member of the Senate Naval Affairs committee, and Prof. Edwin Borahard of the Yale University law school. Speaking in behalf of the proposed change will be Cong. J. William Fulbright (D-Ark), member of the house foreign relations committee, and Con. Estes Kefauver (D-Tenn), member of the house judiciary committee. George V. Denny, Jr., founder of "Town Meeting," presides as moderator, in this, the last broadcast before the series returns to Town Hall, New York.

Julius A. Krug, new chairman of the War Production Board, will appear on the March of Time Thursday to clarify WPB's plans on the reconversion of wartime industry to civilian uses. On the same program Basil O'Connor, chairman of the American Red Cross, will broadcast from Paris a report on his first-hand study of conditions in France and the results of a survey now being made of evacuation hospitals and recreation facilities. The program goes on the air at 9:30 p. m. over WEAF.

PARIS DESIGNER BEWAILS DRESS OF U. S. WOMEN

CHICAGO, Oct. 19 — (UP) — "Too much make-up, too much jewelry, too many furs, and those huge flowers they wear. Some of them look like a well-kept grave," is the way Henri de Chatillon, parisian fashion designer, described American women, as he stopped here en route to Mexico City.

He believes, however, that the American woman is the most beautiful of all in face and in form. But "she does not wear her beauty well, except for a chic few." Her dress should be shorter, with softer lines, and more feminine appeal. Her hats, according to Henri, are "atrocious."

Stacks made de Chatillon feel "sick all over"—and positively livid with shame.

There was nothing drab about Henri as he talked about women's fashions, wearing a pink shirt, wine-red tie, and navy blue suit, and with a brilliant fuchsia hat streaked with purple-blue lying on the dresser.

De Chatillon favors simple, graceful gowns with broad hats to shade the face. "Even a young face gains if it is shaded a little," he said. "That horrible off-the-face hat is passing away forever, thank goodness. It was just too revolting."

The men in America are entirely too conventional for Henri, who would like to see collarless shirts, lapelless coats and brighter colors in suitings—even pink or baby blue, which, he said, "I could wear with perfect insouciance, so long as the whole ensemble is harmonious."

Nothing can be done about women's bathing suits, he said, wringing his shoulders. A designer's business is to conceal artfully, and you can conceal nothing in a bathing suit. "Some women," de Chatillon said, "just should not go bathing."

Savannah Eyes Bigger Part In Post-War Era

SAVANNAH, Ga., Oct. 19 — (UP)—A new post-war project destined to build up an extensive seagoing trade for Georgia has been launched by Savannah.

The city has asked the Federal government for aid to improve the present harbor, to lengthen the channel by three miles and to deepen it by four feet over its present 33-mile length.

A cruise down the Savannah river reveals the harbor maintenance activities now under way by the United States corps of engineers.

The government already has spent over \$27,000,000 in building and maintaining Savannah's harbor since 1926, according to an estimate of Lt. Col. H. C. Thomas, Jr., district engineer.

A part of the plans calling for additional harbor improvements has received house approval and is now awaiting senate action.

The plans are included in a provision in the rivers and harbors act calling for the dredging of the Savannah river four feet deeper for a distance of three miles north of the Seaboard Airline railroad bridge.

At a cost of \$300,000 this proposal would make the river 30 feet deep for a total of 30 miles from the sea.

Also under consideration is a Savannah Port Authority Plan. This plan includes the dredging of the river to a depth of 34 feet for the first 26 miles from the sea.

The plan is now before R. F. Rhodes, chief of the river and harbor engineering division at Savannah, who estimated the cost at approximately three and one-quarter million dollars.

All of the work connected with the improvement of the harbor and channel is not in the post-war era, engineers pointed out. The

harbor maintenance crew toils daily to keep the silt from accumulating in the river's floor above the 30-foot depth level. The crew operates a hopper dredge and three pipeline dredges that work up and down the river pumping out the mud at an annual cost of some \$500,000.

According to maintenance engineer W. M. Lucas, the dredges pull 10 million cubic yards of dirt annually from the river bed.

COLUMBUS, O., Oct. 19 — (AP)—Ohio industrial payrolls dropped three per cent from June to July while total employment declined less than one-half of one per cent, a report by Ohio State university's Bureau of Business Research covering 8,565 firms showed today.

Compared with the same month last year, July employment was down five per cent and payrolls had increased less than one-half of one per cent.
