

ANCIENT GREEKS HAD NO JIVE BANDS OR SYMPHONY ORCHESTRAS

If we look back at the music of the ancient Greeks, we find that it but more often the number was was different from ours in many four, seven or 10. The strings were ways. No pianos existed in Greece, and neither were there violins trombones or saxophones.

Some lyres had three strings, equal, or almost equal, in length. They differed in thickness, and it seems that certain of them were strung more tightly than others. Holding a lyre with one hand, a Greek would thrum the strings

with the other, while singing or reciting poetry. Usually he was seated while this was going on. The Greeks spoke of Apollo as the god of music and poetry. When they made pictures of them, they

often showed him holding a lyre. Of the wind instruments, the flute was far more common than the trumpet. The Greek flute was like that of Egypt. It had two pipes. The player blew through a single mouthpiece, in the same position as the mouthpiece of a modern clarinet. The air, or "wind," went from the single mouthpiece through both pipes of the flute.







