"Gulliver's Travels" Topic Of Air Program Saturday

Jonathan Swift's brilliant satire, "Gulliver's Travels," is the second presentation on the University of the Air literature series, "The World's Great Novels." It will be heard Saturday over WEA-F at 6 p. m., Lima time.

Written in 1727, "Gulliver's Travels" is Swift's most famous book. A profound satire, it is one of the literary world's best models of style. Beginning with Gulliver's account of himself, Swift's work then details his journeys to Lilliput, Brobdignag, Laputa, Balnibarbi, Luggnagg, Japan and Houyhnhms. It is thru these travels that Swift expressed his own cynical regard for mankind.

ADVISES PARENTS KEEP AILING KIDDIES HOME

STATE COLLEGE, Pa., Oct. 20.—(UP)—Parents who send their children to school when they show signs of illness may have dangerous rewards along with a cherished perfect attendance record. This is the opinion of Dr. F. E. Ritener of Pennsylvania State College. Pointing to the many serious diseases—infantile paralysis, tonsillitis, and rheumatic fever—which frequently start with vague body pains, Dr. Ritener urges that parents consider such symptoms as warning signals and not mere old-fashioned "growing pains."

SYNTHETIC SHOE SOLE CALLED MORE DURABLE

NEW YORK, Oct. 21—(UP)—A shoe sole made of non-critical chemicals and represented as more durable than present leather and rubber was hailed as the answer to the war-born leather shortage and shoe rationing at the Victory Shoe Show here recently.

Elliot E. Simpson, discoverer of the synthetic soles, told a gathering of rubber manufacturers that "millions of pairs of shoes had been made with the soles," and had qualities of great flexibility, water resistance, cohesion, and adaptability to color. Platforms for women's shoes, made of dense sponge, were displayed by the manufacturers group and described as stylish and comfortable enough to allow women "to walk instead of hop, skipping and jumping."

12,000 PLAYERS APPEAR IN "WILSON" AT QUILNA THEATRE

Heralded as the most important event in 50 years of motion picture history, Darryl F. Zanuck's technicolor production of "Wilson" is now playing at the Quilna theatre.
