

WASHINGTON, Oct. 21 - (AP)The number of workers added to factory payrolls during August fell behind the number who quit, entered the aimed forces or were laid off, the Labor department reported today.

For every 1,000 factory workers 62 quit, seven were discharged, five were laid off, and four left to enter the armed forces, for a total of 78 separations. Secretary Perkins said. Only 62 new workers per 1,000 were hired. In July the quit rate was 56 per 1,000.

The tetal separation rate for women in all manufacturing was reported as 95 per 1,000 as against 67 for men.
