Farm Wages Rise 13%

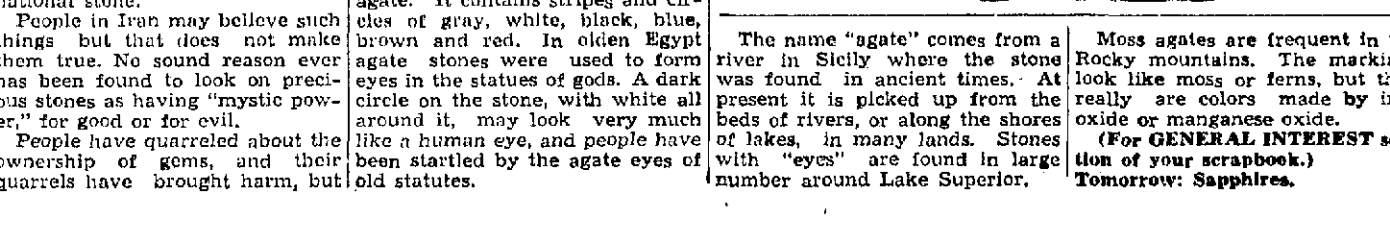
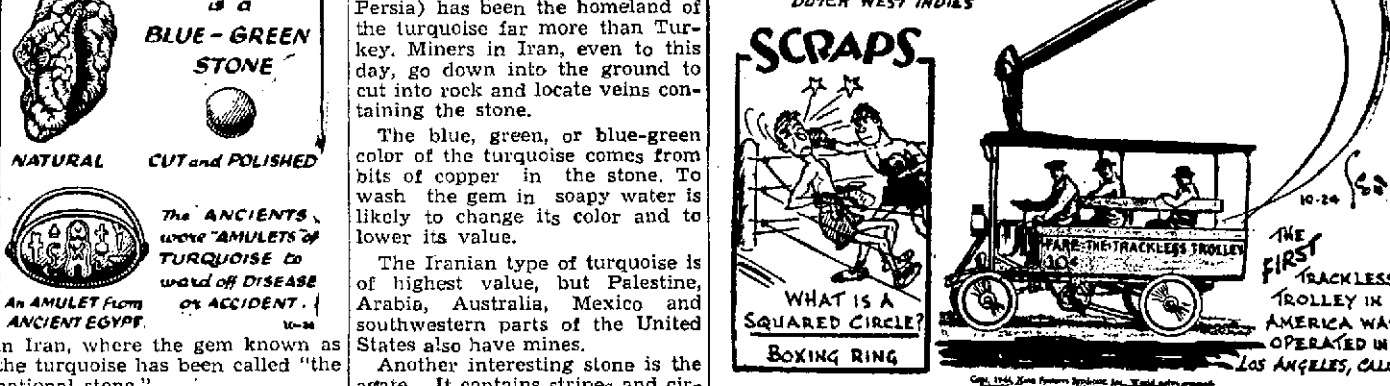
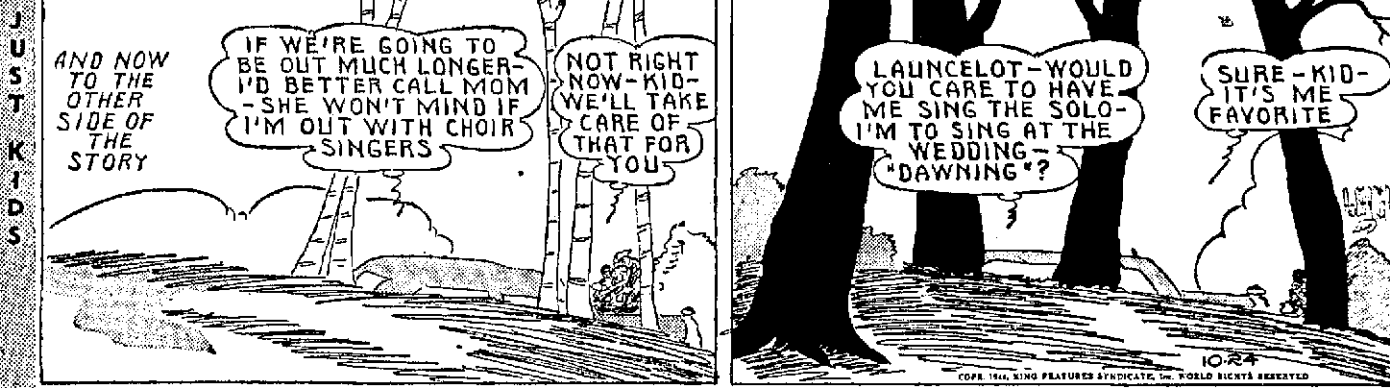
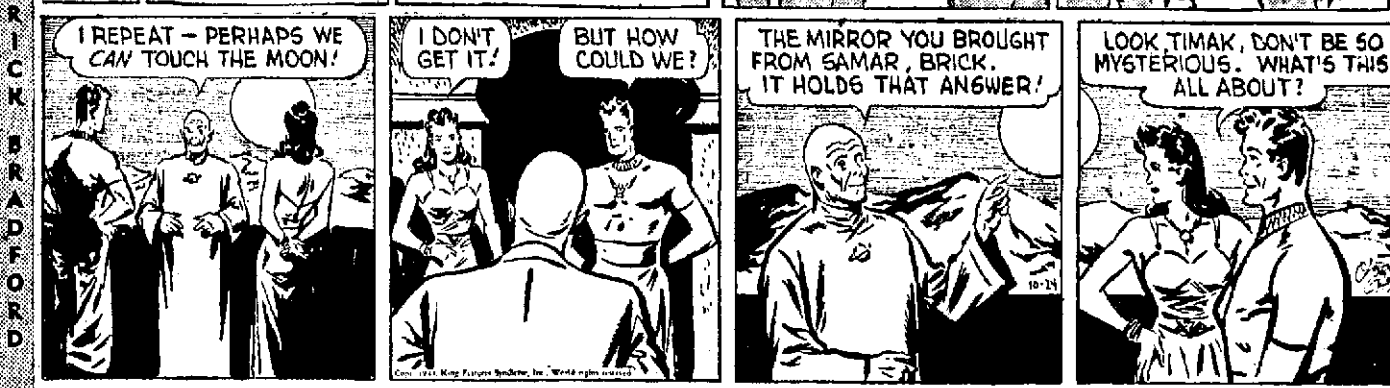
Wages paid by Wisconsin farmers are 13 per cent above those of a year ago, according to the crop reporting service of the Wisconsin and U. S. departments of agriculture.
Wage rates as reported by Wisconsin crop correspondents in October were a little higher than in July. The October rates generally are the highest reported for the year.
October 1 wage rates as reported by Wisconsin crop correspondents averaged \$74 per month with board and \$103 without board. Farm laborers working by the day received \$3.00 with board and \$4.00 without board. A year ago farm wages per month with board averaged \$65.25 and \$89.25 without board. Rates per day were \$3.50 with board and \$4.40 without board.
