CANADIAN SAYS VOICE TOLD HIM TO KILL WIFE

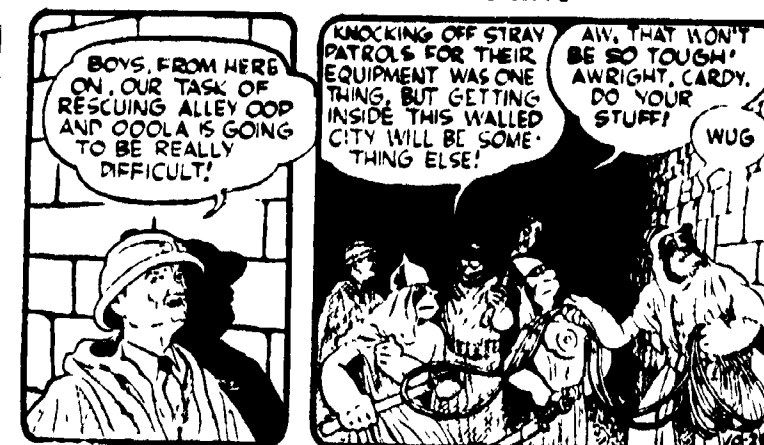
NEW YORK, Oct. 25—(UP)—Lewis Wolfe, diminutive, 37-year-old Canadian who killed his pretty, red-haired wife to fill a Biblical pact, told today of a strong voice that whispered in his ear, telling him to slay her because she had sinned.

Wolfe's attorney asked for an adjournment of the murder trial until today when the defendant's voice faltered last night as he attempted to tell of the slaying.

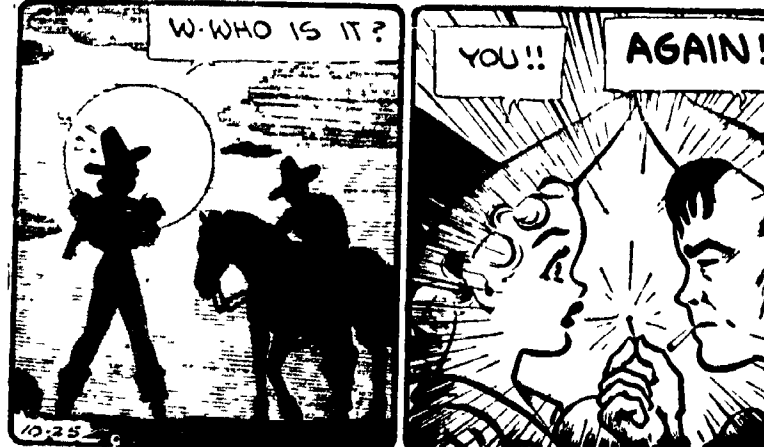
Wolfe, whose wrist was bandaged where he attempted to commit suicide in his jail cell by slashing it with his broken spectacles, was overcome by the telling of his story.

His wife, a former dancer who came to his home in Palestine first as governess for his two children, dared him to carry out their pre-nuptial pact that gave the offended mate the right to take the life of one who broke their vow of fidelity, he said.

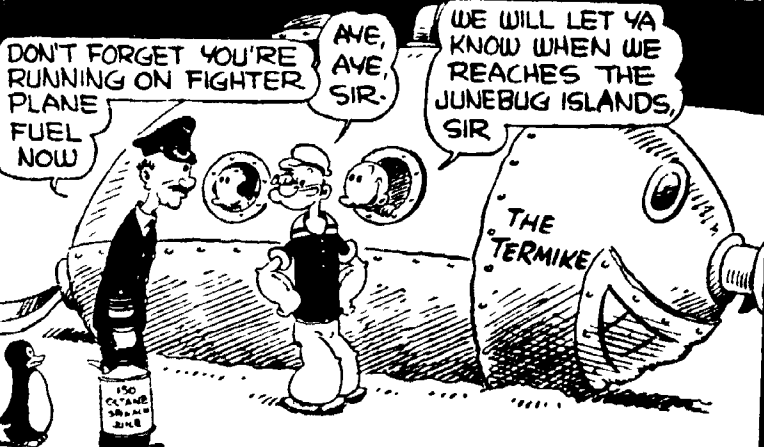

PLAN FURIOUS REICH BOMBING

Supreme Headquarters, AEF, Oct. 25—(UP)—Germany will be subjected to the worst winter bombing of the war during the coming weeks and months, it was revealed today, under an Allied plan of battle that envisages the possible knockout of the Reich by airpower alone in the unlikely event the ground offensive in the west should bog down.

Authoritative sources said the recent Saturday attacks on such key German centers as Duisburg and Cologne were only a forerunner of the systematic destruction in store for Germany if she refuses to capitulate.
