Emeralds have a history which goes far back into ancient times They were sold on the market in Babylon 6,000 years ago, and they were prized by the kings of Egypt. In Egypt today there are the remains of old emerald mines.

It may be that Egypt was the place from which the Roman emperor, Nero, obtained a certain emerold. This stone seems to have been cut and sanded down until it made a lens of light green coloz.

A Roman historian tells us that Nero used his emerald lens while watching fights on the arena. He was near-sighted, and the lens may have served him very much as eye-glasses serve people today. Perhaps the greenish color was "restful" to him as he watched gladiators strike one another down.






