LONDON RAPS FDR ON FOREIGN POLICY

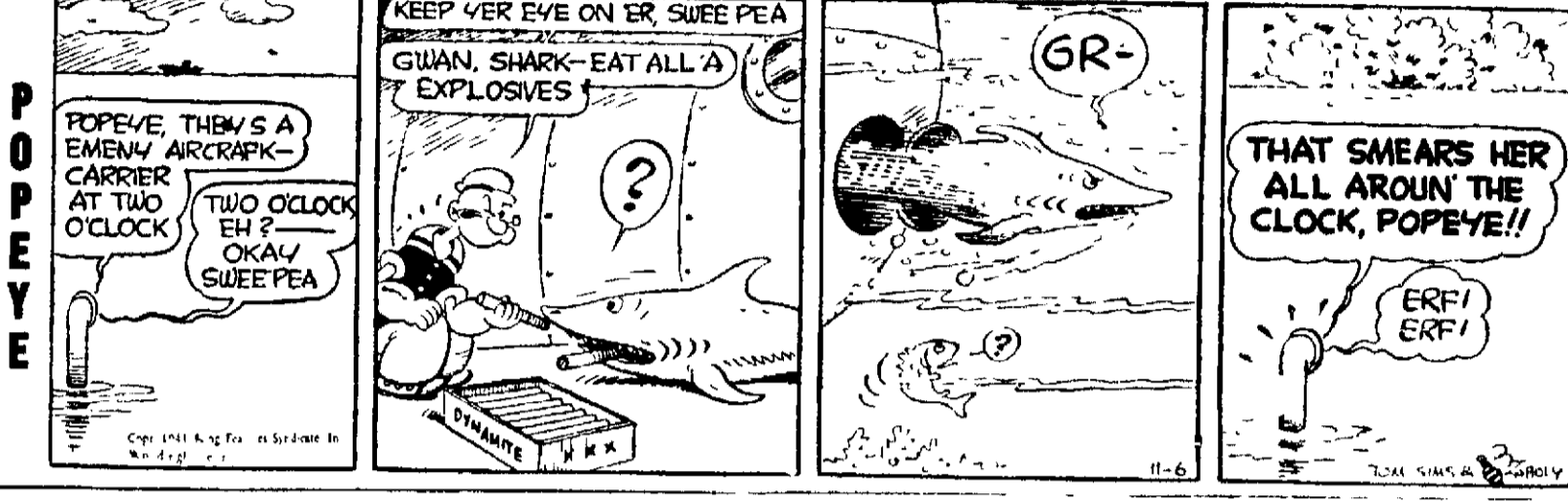
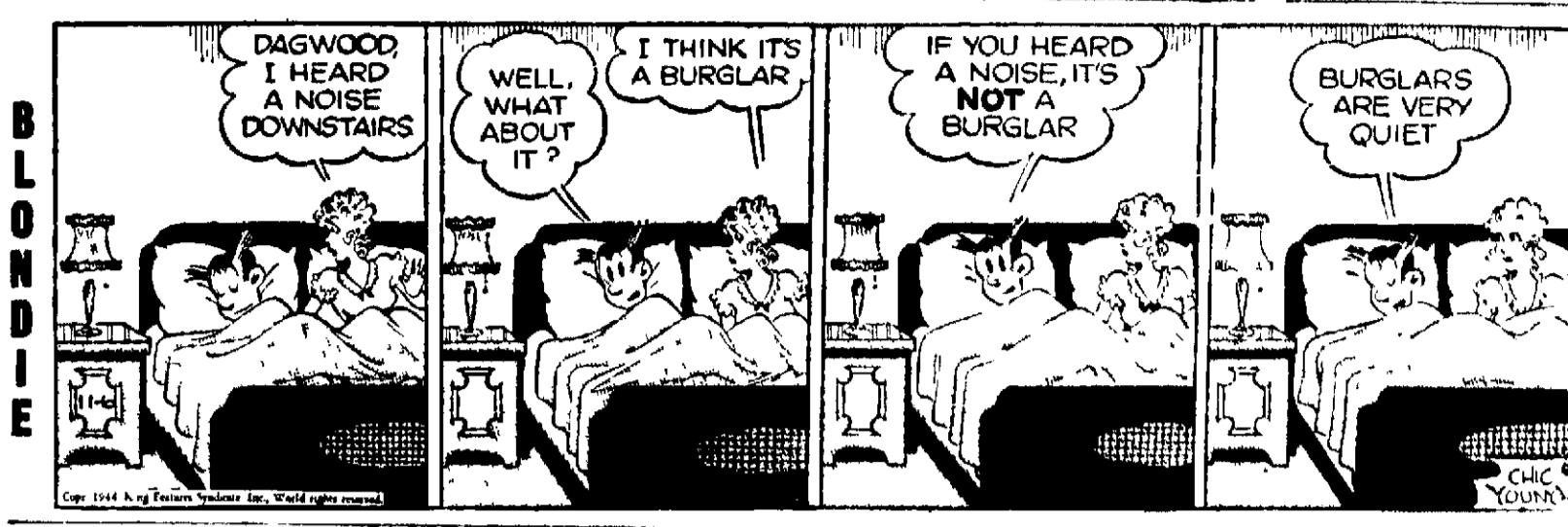
OAKLAND, Neb., Nov. 6 — (AP)—Alf M. Landon declared here today that President Roosevelt "has the ambition of a Caesar" but in handling foreign affairs has "fizzled x x x the same as he has in domestic affairs."

"China is the latest demonstration of the blundering and ineptness of his one-man diplomatic system," the former Kansas governor and 1936 GOP presidential nominee said in a speech prepared for a Republican rally here and released by him.

The China situation "along with Morgenthau's ghostly plan has prolonged the war many months and cost many thousands of needless casualties," Landon asserted.

The President's "quips have become dangerous in international relations," the Kansan said.

TWO VAN WERT MEN KILLED IN EUROPEAN WAR

VAN WERT Nov. 6—Two more Van Wert-co men have been reported killed in action bringing the county's war casualty list to 41. Another was reported missing and still another reported a prisoner of war.

Mr. and Mrs. Pearl Brown of Liberty-tp were notified that their son, Pvt. Buster Brown, 21, was killed in action on the Italian front while serving with the infantry.

Pvt. Brown was inducted last January and had been overseas since August. He is survived by his parents, seven brothers, Sgt. Emmett in the South Pacific, Arthur in Australia, Joseph of Lima and Raymond, Leland, Junior and Eugene, all at home, and three sisters, Mrs. Lela Adelblue of Ohio City, Dorothy, at home, and Marjorie of Van Wert.

Pvt. Raymond W. Shaw, 35, husband of Mrs. Coryl Lucille Snaw of Hoaglin-tp, was killed in Germany, Oct. 21, while serving with Gen. Hodges' First Army. He had been in service since Sept. 27, 1943, and overseas five months.

Besides his widow he is survived by his mother, Mrs. Eliza Shaw of Van Wert; two brothers, John of Ft. Wayne, and Floyd of Van Wert and a foster sister.

Mrs. Julia Coats-High of Venedocia was notified that her husband, S. Sgt. Wilbur Gale Hoch, 20, radio gunner on a B-17, was reported missing Oct. 13, of Yugoslavia. He is a son of Mr. and Mrs. Ray High of Liberty-tp.

S. Sgt. Doyle Poling of Hoaglin-tp, chief engineer and turret gunner on a Fortress, reported missing Sept. 28, over Germany, has been reported a prisoner of Germany. In service since March 30, 1943, Sgt. Poling had more than 70 missions to his credit.

Mrs. Betty Grubb Longworth of Van Wert received word that her husband, S. Sgt. Carl Longworth, who was reported missing Aug. 16 over Yugoslavia, had returned to his base in Italy and was unharmed.

Loretta Young Stars On Cavalcade Program Monday

The great spirit of "Jane Addams—Woman of Courage" is epitomized in drama with Loretta Young in the title role on "Cavalcade of America" Monday, over WEAF at 7 p. m., Lima time. Walter Huston is host and program narrator.

The script recalls how Jane Addams, born in Illinois in the mid-nineteenth century, was impelled to help the less fortunate people of Chicago. She founded the now-famous Hull House and in so doing aroused the antagonism of local politicians and businessmen until the first Hull House was wrecked by an overwhelming mob. But Miss Addams worked day and night to rebuild. With the help of a group of businessmen, it was rebuilt and Miss Addams later became a major force in re-writing the labor laws of the state. She was awarded the Nobel Peace Prize.
