Income Total To Individuals Shows Upturn

WASHINGTON, Nov. 10 (INS) — Income payments to individuals for the first three calendar quarters of 1944 were \$115,000,000, almost double those for the corresponding period of 1929, the last boom year before the depression, the Commerce department announced today.

The department pointed out however, that dividends and interest earnings chalked up for the first nine months of this year — \$7,500,000,000 — fell about a billion dollars short of the 1929 figure for the same period.

Commerce officials said that individuals earned \$81,750,000,000 in salaries and wages in the first nine months of 1944, again more than doubling the figure for the equivalent period of 1929.

Total income payments in the month of September, 1944, were \$13,500,000,000. Of this figure, \$9,250,000,000 were paid out in salaries and wages and \$4,250,000,000 in dividends and interest.

The September salaries and dividends topped those of the preceding month of August, the department said, and estimated that workers earned \$72,000,000 more in salary and wages, and that investors gained about a billion dollars more in dividends and interest in September than they did in August.

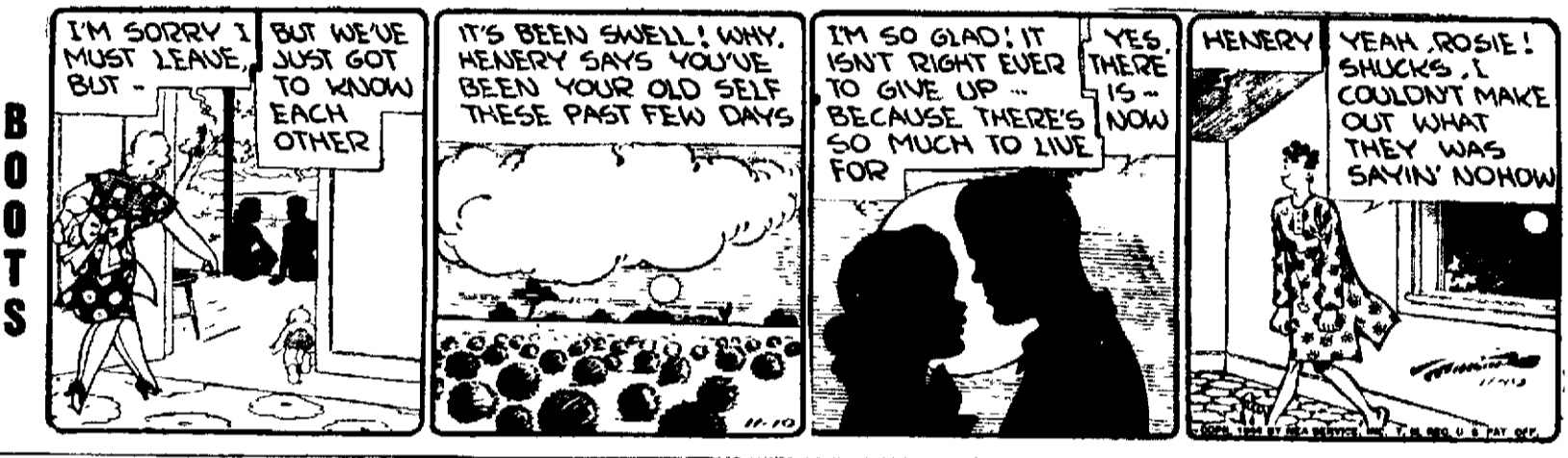
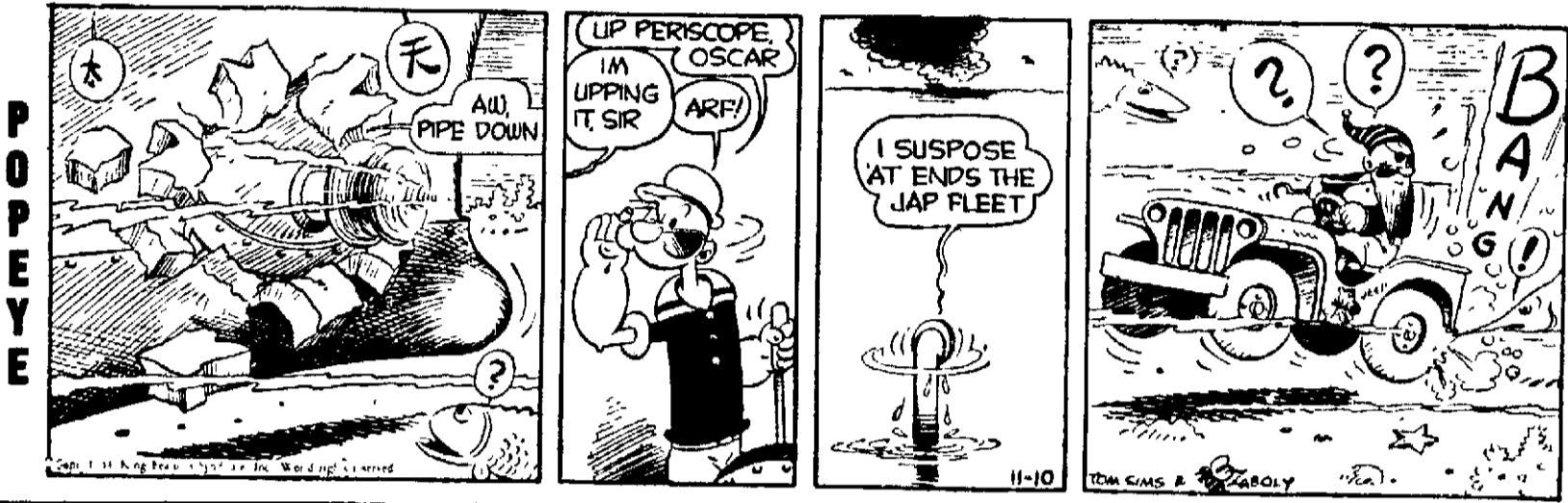
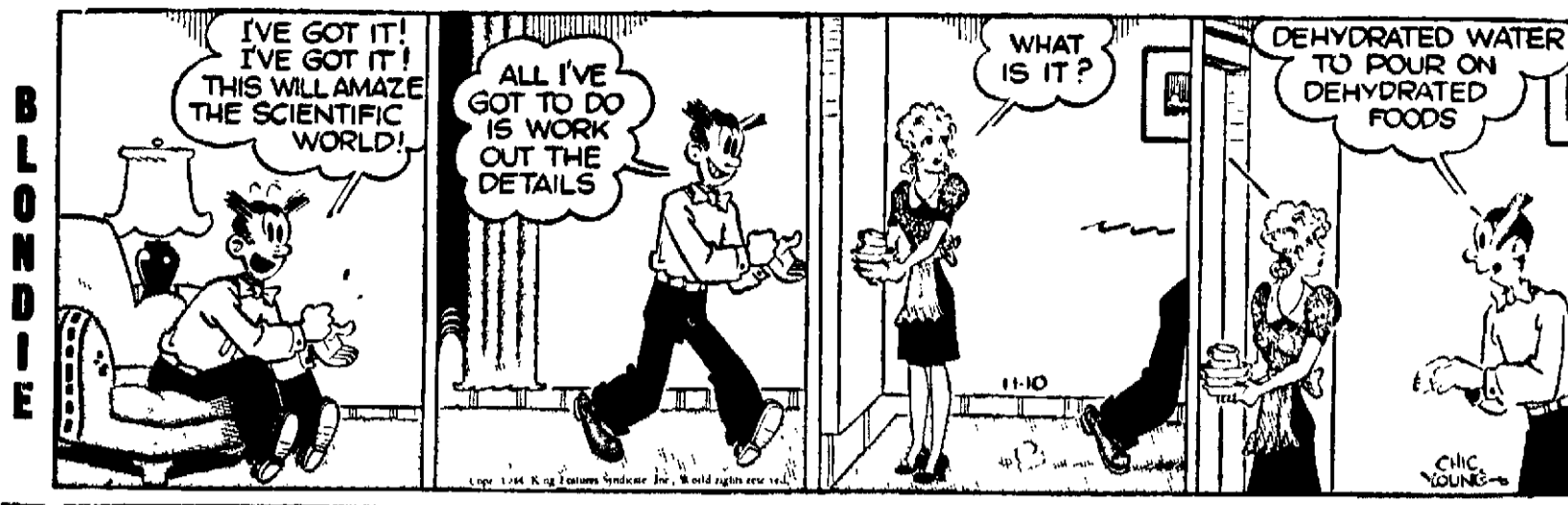
ELIDA COUPLE TO MARK 50TH ANNIVERSARY

HOUSING UNITS AVAILABLE FOR MARRIED VETS

HIRAM, O., Nov. 10 — (AP)—The Federal Housing Authority has opened 1,000 wartime low rent housing units for use of returning married servicemen who may want to attend Hiram college. Dr. Paul H. Fall, president of the institution, announced today.

The units are located at Windham, eight miles from Hiram. The FHA will rent the units to families or veterans at low cost while they are enrolled at Hiram to receive the educational benefits granted by the G. I. bill of rights.

Dr. Fall said he believed this was the first instance in which war housing was made available to discharged servicemen continuing their education. He said the number of veterans living at the project probably would be small until demobilization began, but added he thought provisions should be made for them well in advance of that time.

The plan occurred to him, he explained, when he found that only a third of the units, originally built to accommodate workers at the nearby Ravenna ordnance plant, now were occupied.
