WAR WORKER IS HELD IN MURDER

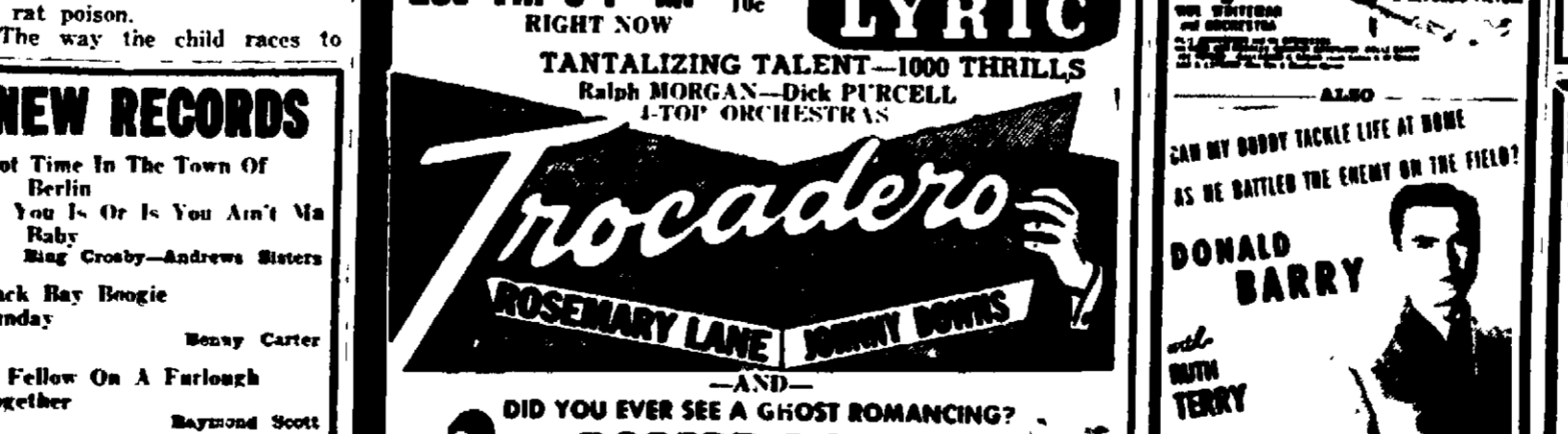
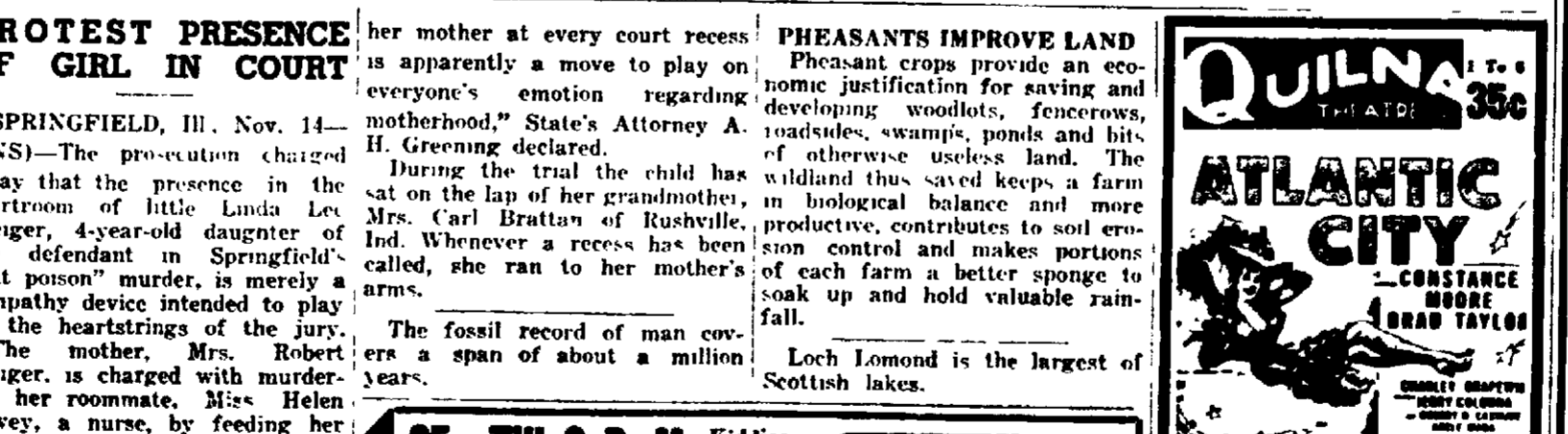
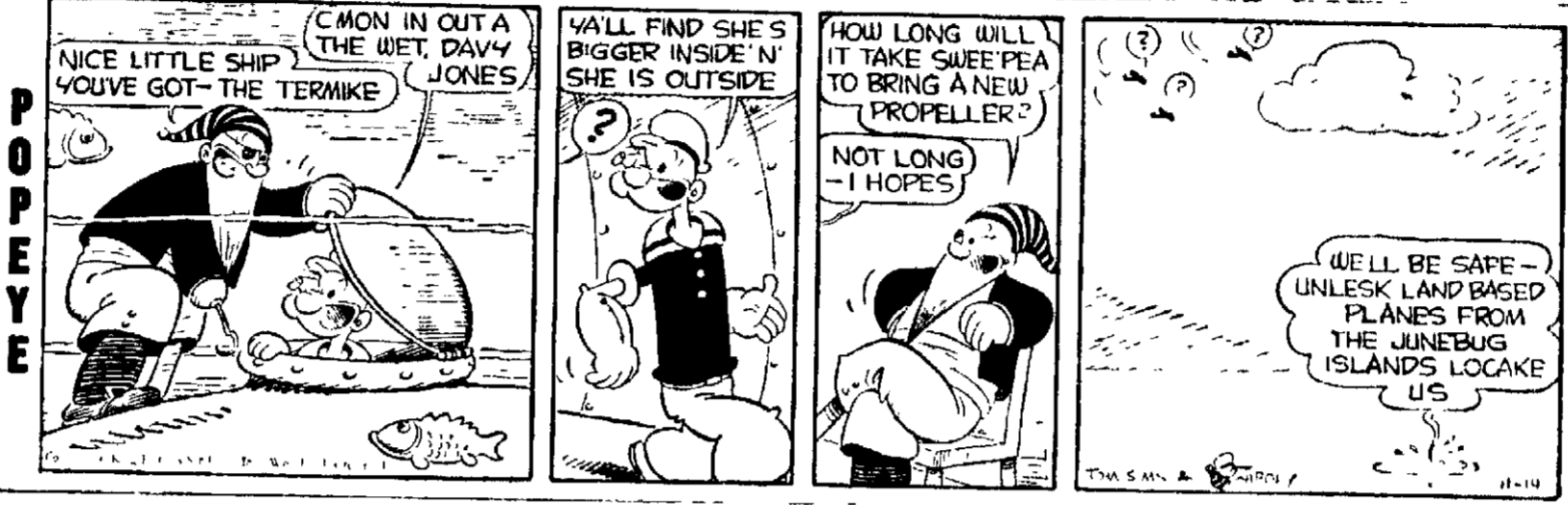
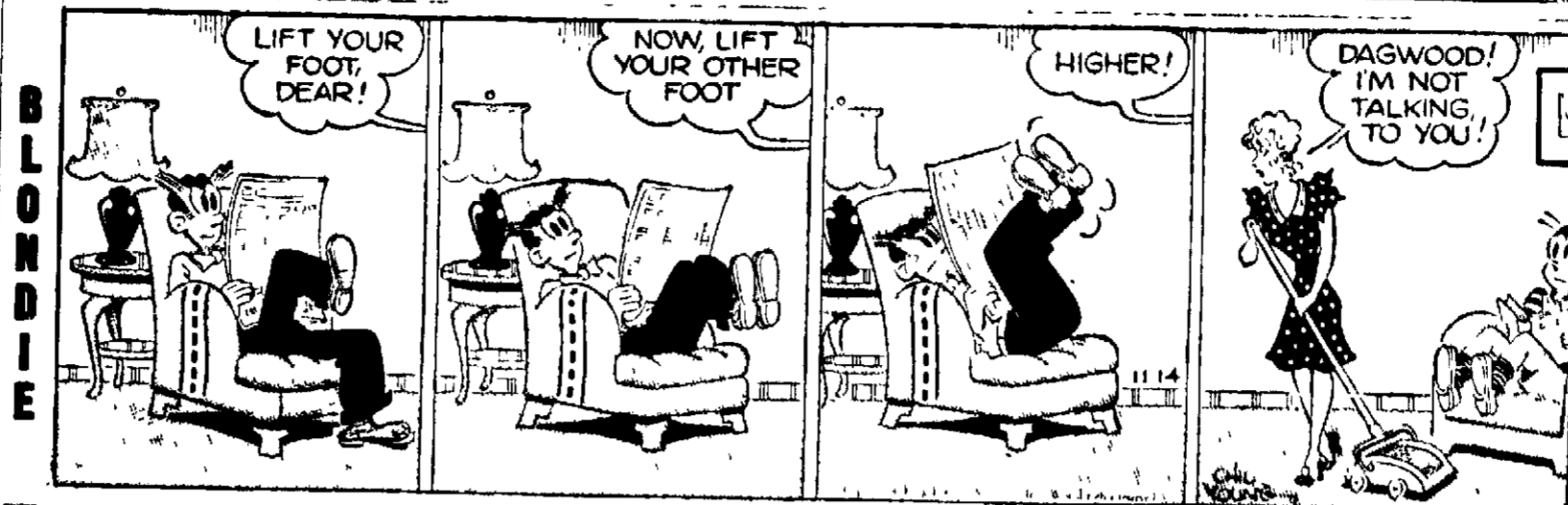
WAUSEON, O., Nov. 14.—(AP)—Clair S. Kauffman, 25-year-old war worker, was held in jail here today on a first degree murder warrant after Sheriff L. R. Irwin reported the man confessed killing his pretty 21-year-old wife because he "was tied down too much."

Mrs. Kauffman was slain the night of Oct. 19 and Kauffman first said his wife was killed by the accidental discharge of a shotgun he was cleaning.

Sheriff Irwin said, however, that Kauffman signed a statement that he killed his wife on "a sudden impulse."

Irwin quoted Kauffman as saying: "Looking at the history of my life, the only reason I can give for doing it would be that I was tied down too much, in other words, not enough freedom. I can see no other reason for shooting my wife. We always got along 100 per cent."

FORMER INS WRITER DIES IN DETROIT

DETROIT, Nov. 14.—(INS)—Funeral arrangements were being made today for William J. Butler, telegraph editor of The Detroit Times and former International News Service staff correspondent, who died Saturday night of a heart attack at the age of 50.

Butler joined the staff of International News Service in 1916 and worked in the New York, Philadelphia and St. Louis bureaus. He also worked in the London, England, office of INS and when the First World War ended was sent to Paris to cover the peace conference at Versailles. He later was transferred to the Paris bureau.

Butler returned to the United States in 1922 and at various times was feature editor of The Detroit News, publicity director for Seagrams Distilleries in New York, and telegraph editor of The Philadelphia News.

WOMAN LOSES LIFE IN CLEVELAND FIRE

CLEVELAND, Nov. 14.—(INS)—A 71-year-old woman was dead today and two other persons were suffering from burns as the result of three fires in Cleveland.

Mrs. Flora Carlton was trapped and overcome by smoke as fire broke out in her east side home; Miss Maxine Mazur was burned when police said, her hotel room had caught fire from a burning cigarette; and Robert G. Glawe was caught in a blast of fire and smoke as he entered his home where an undetected fire was blazing.

PROTEST PRESENCE OF GIRL IN COURT

SPRINGFIELD, Ill., Nov. 14.—(INS)—The prosecution charged today that the presence in the courtroom of little Linda Lee Steiger, 4-year-old daughter of the defendant in Springfield's "rat poison" murder, is merely a sympathy device intended to play on the heartstrings of the jury.

The mother, Mrs. Robert Steiger, is charged with murdering her roommate, Miss Helen Hovey, a nurse, by feeding her a peanut butter sandwich containing rat poison.

"The way the child races to her mother at every court recess is apparently a move to play on everyone's emotion regarding motherhood," State's Attorney A. H. Greening declared.

During the trial the child has sat on the lap of her grandmother, Mrs. Carl Brattan of Rushville, Ind. Whenever a recess has been called, she ran to her mother's arms.
