WAUSEON, O., Nov. 14--(AP) -- Clair S. Kauffman, 25 year-old war worker, was held in jail here. today on a first degree murder warrant after Sheriff L. R. Irwin reported the man confessed killing his pretty 21-year-oid wife because he "was tied down too much." Mrs. Kauffman was slain the night of Oct. 19 and Kauffman first said his wife was killed by the accidental discharge of a shotgun he was cleaning. Sheriff Irwin said, however, that Kauffman signed a statement that he killed his wife on "a sudden impulse.' Irwin quoted Kauffman as saying: : "Looking at the history of my life, the only reason I can give for doing it would be that I was, tied down too much, in other words, not enough freedom. I can
