

# Alec Templeton To Be Guest On Sinatra Show

Alec Templeton, the blind virtuoso of the piano, will be the visiting guest star on the Frank Sinatra show, next Wednesday at 8 p. m., Lima time over WABC. This will be Sinatra's last Wednesday night broadcast. Beginning Nov. 20 his half-hour show will be aired regularly Monday nights at 8 p. m. over CBS. Eileen Barton and Axel Stordahl's orchestra are program regulars with "The Voice."

### Ann Revere Plays Part Of A Potted Palm

HOLLYWOOD — Ann Revere just missed winning an Academy award last March as Jennifer Bonetti's mother in "The Song of Bernadette." Right now she's on the screen as a "potted palm" in the Dorothy Lamour technicolor "Rainbow Island." Potted palm is Ann's own description of the role.

"They put me in a green satong, stuck some leaves in my hair, said I was the queen of the island and then left me standing on top of a sand dune with nothing to say. A potted palm could have played the part."

But don't get the idea that Ann Revere is complaining. She likes variety in her screen roles. And Hollywood, so quick to type people, is giving her just that, recognizing her as a versatile character actress.

Hollywoodites, usually hop a train for New York when caught in the screen's type casting rut. Ann Revere hopped a train for Hollywood when New York producers typed her as a neurotic female following three years of foot-light stardom in "The Children's Hour."

It was in Hollywood that she finally proved her versatility. In her first movie, in 1934, she played an ingenue. "A trifle faded but still an ingenue," she laughs.

Since that she has played a school teacher, a horror woman in a Boris Karloff chiller, Jack Benny's secretary in "The Meanest Man in the World," a Billie Burke type in "Standing Room Only," Crazy Mary in the new Thin Man picture, and currently that "potted palm," as Benny's secretary, she was practically a glamor girl. But she had only three lines of dialog.

Day after the film's preview a friend called her up and said, "Ann darling, I saw you in that picture last night. You looked so beautiful but I kept waiting for you to say something."

Since winning an Academy nomination for her role as the mother of Bernadette, Ann Revere has become a somebody. In fact, she'll probably be nominated again this year for her role of the mother in M-G-M's forthcoming "National Velvet."

She plays the role of an English woman, first to swim the English Channel, who becomes the mother of four children. One of them, 12-year-old Elizabeth Taylor, wins a horse in a raffle for a shilling and is added to entering the nag in the English turf classic, the Grand National.

With the help of a disbarred jockey (Mickey Rooney) and her mother's sporting instinct, the girl trains the horse and it wins the race.

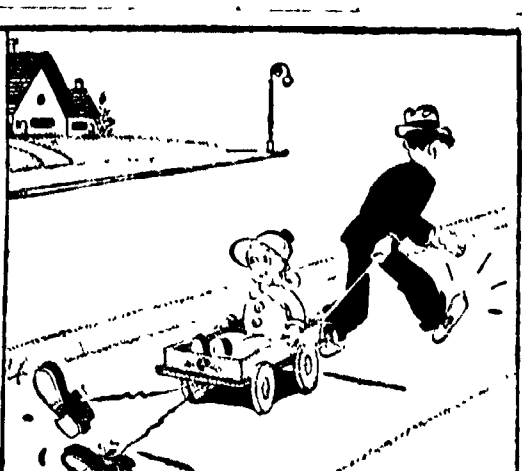
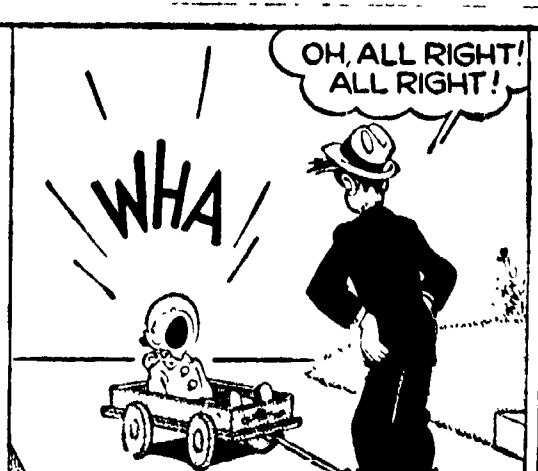
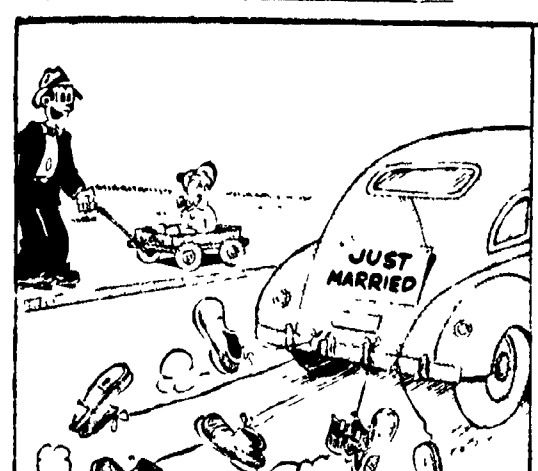
