

He believed that the tower would stand if the upper stories were made so as to allow for the leaning. He knew an import fact — that the "center of weight" must not be beyond the side of the structure. That architect died long before

he building was finished, but his dea has been proved correct by the passage of time. The top story — the eighth — was completed about 1350, and the tower has stood ever since. Thousands of persons from foreign lands have visited Pisa, chiefly to see the tower which leans but does not fall.
