EAST LIVERPOOL BUS STRIKE TO BE TERMINATED

EAST LIVERPOOL, O., Nov. 24—(AP)—Resumption of local and interstate bus service was scheduled today after Mayor Arnold W. Devon announced settlement of a strike involving 30 maintenance employees of the Valley Motor Transit Co.

The men, members of the AFL International Association of Mechanics, agreed to return to work, the mayors said, after Army representatives intervened in the dispute which hampered war industry operations in Midland and Beaver, Pa., and Toronto and Steubenville, O.

The union agreed to negotiate with the company on the grievance which precipitated the walkout last Wednesday. Union Secretary Johnson said the men left their jobs protesting pay deductions of a mechanic who had been ill.

Next day the girl brought a group of neighborhood kids to Jack's matinee and warned them, "When this fellow Jack Benny comes on the stage I don't want to hear one laugh. Don't even smile. The first one that laughs I'm gonna punch straight in the nose."

The kids, sitting in the first two rows, didn't laugh. Neither did they smile. They just stared at Benny. No matter what he did he couldn't even get a giggle out of them. It blew him higher than a kite and he muffed every gag.

Years later in Los Angeles Jack met the pig-tailed little girl working in a department store and married her!

But not until she mentioned it did he recognize her as the brat who had sabotaged his act in Vancouver.

Says Mary Livingstone, who is still heckling him: "That night when I played the violin and Jack held his nose I said I'd get even with him. I didn't do badly next day when I loused up his gags. But I didn't dream then that I'd marry him to really complete the job."

You'll be seeing Jack in a new movie soon, "The Horn Blows at Midnight." As usual, he takes a ribbing in the script for his penny pinching. Offstage, this Benny characteristic, dreamed up by his writers, has cost him a small fortune. Just to be sure no one takes it seriously, he goes out of his way to grab the check and tip double.
